Yun Kyong Kim, Organist

Praised by concertgoers as an artist who "stretches the limits of the instrument," concert organist **Yun Kyong Kim** is passionate about bringing musically

diverse programs to her audiences and is in great demand as an organ and harpsichord recitalist. Reviewers have described her as "a splendid keyboard soloist" (*Dayton Daily News*) and that she "plays with great sensitivity and with great élan" (*The Diapason*). Yun was born in Korea and moved to the United States at the age of sixteen. After early organ study with Carole Terry at the University of Washington, she

received her doctoral degree in organ performance with minors in early music and music theory in 2005 from Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University, where her principal teachers were Christopher Young and Elisabeth Wright. She has also studied and performed in North Germany and France, and made her French debut in Paris at Sainte-Clotilde in 1997. Dr. Kim was awarded First Prize at the 1993

Northwest Regional Competition for Young Organists, and was Third Prize winner at the 2000 National Young Artists Competition in Organ Performance at the American Guild of Organists National Convention in Seattle. Here at Church Street UMC this acclaimed artist will play a wide variety of works by composers such as Leo Sowerby, Johann Sebastian Bach, Joseph Bonnet and Iain Farrington.

Westminster College Choir in Concert with Joe Miller, Director

Setting the standard for choral excellence for 91 years, the Westminster Choir is composed of students at Westminster Choir College, a division of Rider University's Westminster College of the Arts, in Princeton, N.J. The ensemble's 2011–2012 season includes a concert tour of the South, performances at its home in Princeton, radio and television broadcasts and its annual residency at the Spoleto Festival USA. The Westminster College Choir has made two recordings with Maestro Joe Miller. The choir's debut recording with Maestro Miller, *Flower of Beauty*,

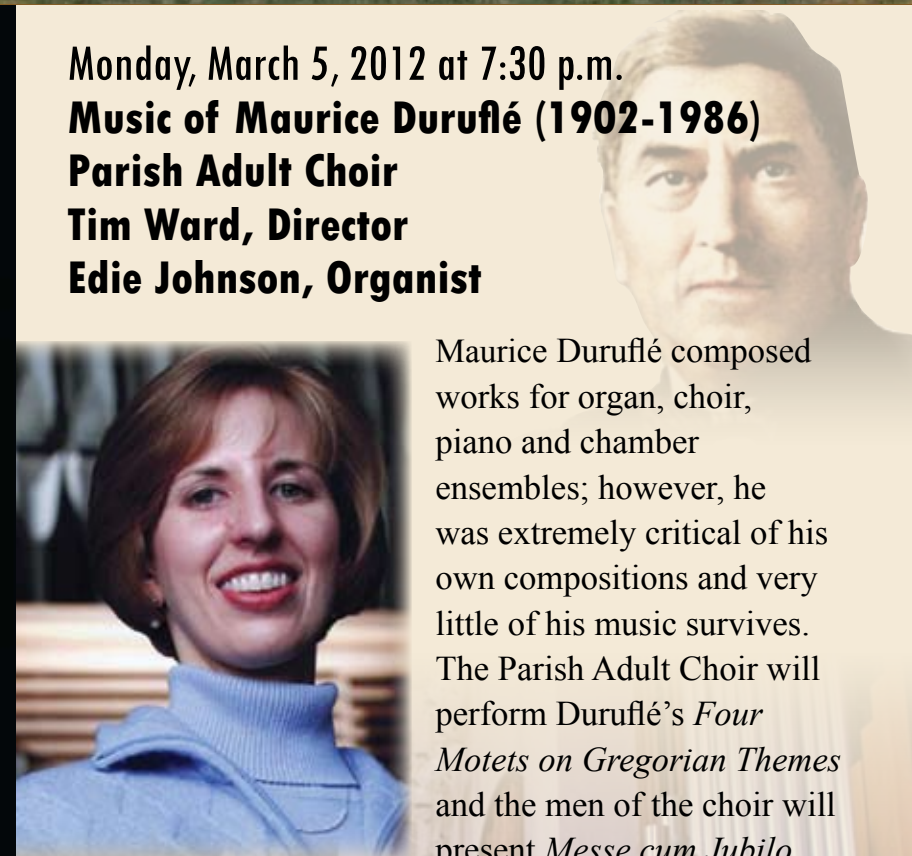
received four stars from *Choir and Organ* magazine and earned critical praise from *American Record Guide*, which described the Westminster Choir as "the gold standard for academic choirs in America."

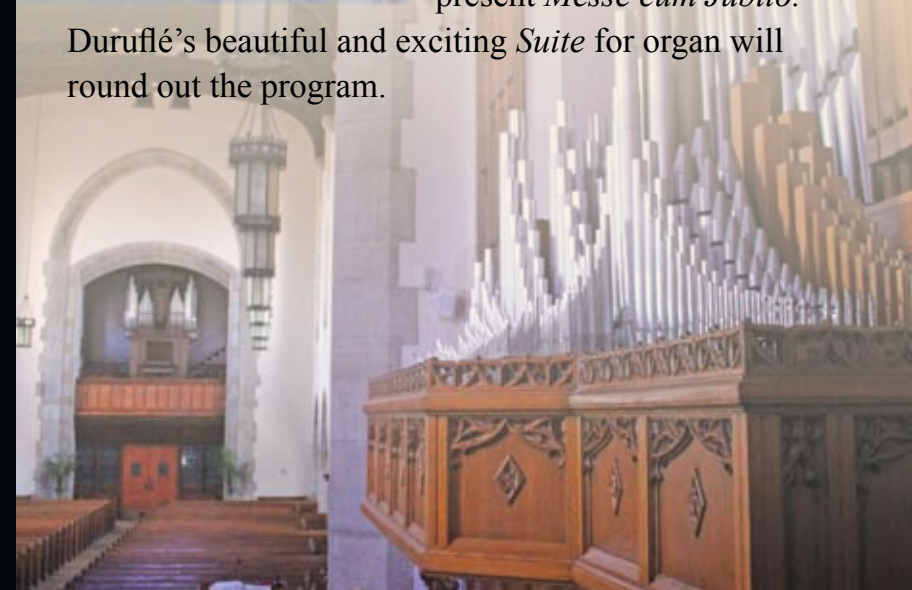
Joe Miller is conductor of two of America's most renowned choral ensembles—the Westminster Choir and the Westminster Symphonic Choir. As director of choral activities at Westminster Choir College he also oversees an extensive choral program that includes eight ensembles. His season with the Westminster Symphonic Choir includes collaborations with the New York Philharmonic and Peter Schreier (*Handel's Messiah*), the Berlin Philharmonic and Simon Rattle (*Mahler's Symphony No. 2*) and The Philadelphia Orchestra and Yannick Nezet-Seguin, (*Brahms' Ein deutsches Requiem*).

Maurice Duruflé composed works for organ, choir, piano and chamber ensembles; however, he was extremely critical of his own compositions and very little of his music survives. The Parish Adult Choir will perform Duruflé's *Four Motets on Gregorian Themes* and the men of the choir will present *Messe cum Jubilo*.

Duruflé's beautiful and exciting *Suite* for organ will round out the program.
