
Winter Weather Closing Policy



First Recipient of HARP Expresses Gratitude



Unbeknownst to Melissa (Missy) Adkins, pictured left, her decision to participate in the Beacon of Hope Getting Ahead class would lead to many blessings over the next 4+ years. She graduated from the first Getting Ahead class and volunteered in the Sharing Shop and Food Co-Op. While looking for a job, she was connected to the Church Street Preschool, where she accepted a position and is now working part-time at Church Street helping with event preparation. Now we enjoy seeing her regularly at Church Street events and on Sunday mornings.

Missy had frequent childhood ear infections that began to affect her ability to hear. She also worked in a high-noise manufacturing environment, and like many of us, experienced loud music at concerts. Earlier this year, after a severe ear infection, she realized that her hearing had not returned to where it was before. She had significant hearing loss that required her to use closed captioning when available and learn to read lips. She realized that she could not look someone in the eye while they spoke to her. She had to watch their mouths.

Her Ear, Nose and Throat physician recommended hearing aids, but as is usually the case, her insurance company would not cover the high cost. At a Church Street Wednesday lunch, member Vivian Chance mentioned the new Hearing Aid Repurposing Project (HARP) started by our Parish Health Ministry Team this year, and she connected Missy to Rev. Chesser to complete an application.

On October 31, Missy became the first recipient of a hearing aid for which she is extremely grateful, giving credit to God and the people of Church Street for connecting her to resources that could truly help. She calls it "God's perfect timing" in bringing the right people across her path when she needed them most

Together, let's think about... *Thanksgiving Baskets*

It's that time of year again! The Fall has flown by and our annual Thanksgiving Basket ministry is upon us! For those who have helped before, you know the thrill of assembling over 100 boxes in less than an hour. In a blitz and flurry of activity, youth, children, and adults descend on the gym to assemble the boxes of food. The boxes are assembled and then delivered by members to 120 deserving families all over Knoxville.

But, who receives the food? The short answer is persons served by our Benevolence Team, Beacon of Hope, or the Wesley House Community Center. I have the pleasure of personally knowing some of the families who will be receiving these Thanksgiving Baskets, and you cannot imagine the

depth of their gratitude. For example, one family that will be receiving a Thanksgiving Basket consists of a Great-Grandmother who has custody over her great grandchildren after their family was affected by opioids. Another family is a husband who dutifully cares for his chronically ill wife. Another person recently lost her job and now has to put every penny of her savings toward rent, leaving little money for food.

Each person served through these Thanksgiving Baskets has a different story of need. However, each story also tells of God's goodness and mercy. I hope that you will take the chance to help sort, pack and deliver Thanksgiving Baskets this year. Many of us are blessed to not worry about where our Thanksgiving dinner will come from, and this is our opportunity to provide a meal for families in need.

Here is how you can help:

- Pick up and organize food for the baskets on 11/20.
