## HAPPENING AT CHURCH STREET

### COVID-19 and Church Street

**"Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful." - Colossians 3:15**

As a body of Christ, we *are* thankful and fortunate to have resources to continue our worship and work for the Lord, to have dedicated and prayerful members and staff to visit (limited) and call our most vulnerable, and to have so many arms that reach out into the community, even in times of crisis and uncertainty, to care for our neighbors who are hurting.

Church Street wants to stay connected with you and through you in new and creative ways during this time of social distancing and protecting ourselves and each other. **Holston Conference Bishop Dindy Taylor issued a letter on March 18 that churches in the conference shall suspend all gatherings until further notice; therefore Church Street's worship gatherings, Sunday School classes, and all other in-person meetings, activities, and events have been suspended indefinitely.**

**We are planning ahead for weeks, possibly months, apart and are happy to share the schedule below of how to connect with Church Street (evolving):**

**+ Worship will be shared each Sunday at 10 am online.** These sessions, recorded each Thursday with individuals separately to adhere to social distancing, will honor our Sunday worship services as much as possible, with greetings, music, scripture, children's moments, sermon, prayer, and benediction all included. These will "premiere" on Sundays at 10 am on the Church Street Facebook Page and our website. Due to the visiting restrictions at WVLT, *Rejoice!* at 8 AM on Sundays will, for the foreseeable future, be previously aired content.

**+ Devotion LIVE at Noon, each Monday & Thursday.** These short scripture / homily messages will be shared each Monday and Thursday via our Facebook page using Facebook Live. To view, either tune in at noon on those days live and participate in the comments section, OR you can access the video after it has "aired" live using the links on our Connect webpage: <https://churchstreetumc.org/connect>. All you need is a prayerful heart, about 5-10 minutes, and an Internet connection.

**+ Daily Prayer Guide.** Pastor Jan is putting together beautiful daily prayers that help us connect to and pray for those amongst us who have joys and concerns. These prayers are sent to our Messenger email list each morning, and they are also posted to the webpage above and to our Facebook page.

## STILL SERVING!

CSUMC Missions and Ministries are continuing to serve, even amidst closures and limited resources. Needs of our populations served do not evaporate when a health crisis emerges and evolves. We will continue to serve as long as it is safe for all parties involved.

### Church Street Outreach and Missions:

+ **Soup Kitchen** shifted its seated dining to a take-out option beginning this week. Volunteers arrived early to pack "picnic" bags for guests that included a substantial sandwich, side and fruit, and guests picked these items up in very small numbers at a time. Restroom facilities were made available to guests.

+ **The Benevolence Team** continues to serve, but is conducting all interviews by phone instead of in-person.

+ **Sharing Shop North** (CSUMC campus) is currently closed, but **Sharing Shop South** (Beacon of Hope campus) will re-open for toiletries distribution on a limited-contact basis next week.

+ **Beacon of Hope** is operating its Food Co-Op for the limited number of families it serves on an appointment basis instead of a standard biweekly time.

### Ministries at Church Street

+ **Youth** will try out a Digital NightLife format beginning this week, and Youth Band has already used video conferencing software to meet virtually.

+ Families in our **Children's Ministry** have been given resources for their time together at home, and they have been offered Sunday School bags they may pick up at the church. The Children's Ministry Facebook Page will also feature daily engagement with our kids.

+ **Music** continues, though not in groups, to protect our choir members. Tim is in touch with the choir, and soloists and instrumentalists will be recording special music for our upcoming online worship together.

+ **Congregational Care Committee, Clergy Concerns Group, and Stephen Ministers** are all restructuring their visitation protocol so that our homebound and vulnerable members are protected while continuing to receive meaningful contact from our church family.

+ **Parish Health Ministry**, in coordination with Clergy, staff, and the S.A.S.H. Committee, will continue to help guide our health practices, as they monitor best practices and recommendations from the CDC, the WHO, the TN Department of Health, and the county health department.

### CONTRIBUTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- **Kitchen utensils** – Once I noticed I had 6 wooden spoons. And 4 whisks. I'll bet you do, too. An old set of flatware, an extra potato peeler, a mug set that's collecting dust on the counter? These are luxuries to many people who are struggling. Appliances are great too. They're pricey and there is no substitute for a coffee maker. Pots and pans are a big need too – hard to make a meal without them!

- **Towels, pillows and sheets** – Very basic items that many don't have. Imagine life without towels. Or sheets that fit your bed. Or no pillows. No matter how used, these items are "gold" to some of our neighbors.

- **Tennis shoes** – The #1 requested item we have. Everyone needs good, sturdy shoes, and they can be too expensive for the average person. Men's, women's or kids' tennis shoes – we need them all for the neighbors we serve.

- **Casual clothing** – Jeans, shorts, T-shirts, polo shirts, light jackets are needed. Most occasions in our Beacon area are casual, even jobs. Any size. Male or female.

Spring is a great time to minimalize, and Lent is the perfect time to reflect on what's important. So give something up, *give something to* someone else – and enjoy the feeling of giving back some of the blessings that have come to you.
