### Coming Soon: Lenten Countdown

Jesus taught us that "It is more blessed to give than receive."

As a mother, I believe one of the most important things my husband and I can teach our daughters is how to give joyfully. It is a practice that is developed, beginning with those first lessons of sharing when children are toddlers. As children grow, there are opportunities to talk about how they can give and be a blessing to others. Lessons on giving help to develop empathy and compassion.

They help us to step outside our own experiences and consider what others are going through. They help children see ways in which they can make an impact on the world through actions both big and small.

As you enter the season of Lent, I hope you will consider developing the habit of giving as part of your family's weekly practice. This year, the missions committee will have a "Lenten Countdown" drive for Beacon of Hope and Sharing Shop. Each week, families will select items from a list and add them to their boxes. On Palm Sunday (April 14) the congregation will pray over the completed boxes. We hope this practice will be an opportunity to give with intentionality. Be specific with your thoughts and prayers as you add items to the collection box and think of the people who may receive the gifts.

Notice that I call giving a "practice." Just like any habit, the more we practice giving the easier it becomes. After Lent is over and your Easter eggs have all been eaten, continue to find ways to give. Jesus taught us to give not only to help others but also because of what it does for us. During Lent and beyond, I hope you will allow yourself to feel the joy that giving brings! —GABE BLAKE

# A Call to Prayer and Self Denial Service

On **Tuesday, March 12 at 11:00 a.m.** in the Chapel, United Methodist Women invites all who wish to participate with us in this special service.

Our guest speaker will be **Caryl Griffin Russell, MSN MDiv**, who is an ordained elder of the Holston Conference. The message she will share is entitled:

**“The Healing Power of a Woman’s Touch: Love in Times of Turmoil.”**

Caryl served at First Broad Street UMC in Kingsport and as the Director of the Wesley Leadership Institute, which provides continuing education for pastors and lay leaders in the Holston Conference. Caryl lost her daughter Beth in a laboratory accidental exposure to a monkey virus while Caryl was in seminary. Her daughter’s preventable death led Caryl to working with people facing crises and end-of-life situations, finding hope and life in that journey because of her experience of God through the faith community during this dark hour in her life. She and her late husband, William C. Griffin, MD, established the Elizabeth R. Griffin Foundation and Caryl serves in the extension ministry of the Foundation, which reaches around the world. The foundation works with global leaders, the Gates Foundation, universities, the United Nations, and corporations addressing some of the world’s most imminent threats to health security and seeking the development of effective, practical, and sustainable solutions to meet international standards of practice.

### Together, Let's Think About ... The Greatest Thing



What this means is that I will take official retirement status at the upcoming Holston Annual Conference, June 9-12 at Lake Junaluska and take whatever vacation time I have between then and July 1. It is my intent for my last Sunday to be June 16.

It has been my honor and privilege to serve on this church staff since August 1992. For the past 27 years, I have sought to be faithful to my calling into ministry and to serve this congregation in making disciples of Jesus Christ. I have had numerous responsibilities that changed and evolved over the years. I have served with seven senior pastors, worked along side countless other staff persons and attended too many meetings to even fathom. I had the opportunity to serve with my wife on the staff while she was Director of Children's Ministries. Our time together on staff was an unbelievable experience that we never thought would happen in our ministry. The members of this congregation have helped me grow in my ministry and together we have accomplished things that I never thought possible. Sue and I have raised our children and grandchildren in this congregation.

Please do not read anything into this decision. This decision does not have anything to do with the future of The United Methodist Church nor does it have anything to do with Church Street UMC. It is just my time to retire and I have peace with this decision. After some time away, I will continue to participate in the ministries of Church Street as appropriate and will continue to worship with my family here. I will place my Charge Conference relationship at Church Street.

I want to thank the SPRC Committee, the church staff and the entire congregation for their support over these past many years. It has been a most remarkable and very rewarding journey in Christ's ministry.
