## **Maundy Thursday Communion is a Must**

On Maundy Thursday, April 2, we enact the Last Supper of Jesus and his disciples. (Civil War re-enactors stage mock versions of old battles to recall the sweat of battle. It is not, however, a real battle and no one dies. At Holy Communion, we enact the meal again, and, in the breaking of the bread and the offering of the cup, the Living Christ is among us.)

Maundy Thursday is the day on which we tell again the story of the supper and the terrible events that followed. These events, which took Jesus from hosting the Last Supper to the Cross, became the definitive day of Jesus' life. On the cross, he gave himself for the salvation of the world, even now for us.

The service on Maundy Thursday includes Holy Communion. It continues with the stripping of the altar – a reminder of the stripping of Christ's life from him. It concludes with the chiming of the 39 lashes of the whip. Thus, this is the most solemn service of the Christian year – standing as a counterbalance to the joy of Christmas Eve.

Note that Maundy Thursday Communion will provide our first of the month communion for April. Easter services, on the first Sunday of April, will not include Holy Communion. Come, share this service of Christian devotion on the most moving night of the year.

## Visit the Prayer Labyrinth on Maundy Thursday

Church Street's Prayer Labyrinth will be open in the Chapel for prayer walks and Holy Week Reflection on **Thursday, April 2,** from 9 a.m. - 6 p.m. Note: Walks must be completed by 6:45 p.m. The Maundy Thursday service will begin at 7:15 p.m. with a 10 minute musical prelude in the Nave. Childcare is provided for this service.

## **Easter Egg Hunt**

All children and their families are invited to Whitlow Park in Sequoyah Hills for the egg hunt at 10 a.m. on **Saturday**, **April 4**. The Egg hunt begins promptly at 10. Do not be late or you will miss the event! From Kingston Pike, turn onto Scenic Drive. At the "Y" bear to the right, staying on Scenic. Take an immediate left onto Bluff View and a second right onto Whitlow.



## Reflections

This past Saturday, we gathered in the Nave to observe the passing of Betty Bell, my mother-in-law. I joined the family in the exuberance of the family gathering home. We doted on grandchildren. Laughed at Grandma Betty stories. We used the hill behind the house as our mini-surf scene. The week has been a mixture of exuberance at the gathering of family and our grief of loss of Betty Bell.



Saturday came, and we stood in the presence of her death. As many families have done before us, we stood in silence and in tears to acknowledge the power of what had happened. Death cannot be undone; it is a series of steps that cannot be redone; it is simply done – accomplished. You must stand in respect. You must respect what you cannot change. Death is the ultimate step that you and I cannot change.

By the end of this week, this congregation will observe Maundy Thursday and then Good Friday. We will enact the Last Supper on Thursday. We will walk the Stations of the Cross on Friday around the greater Market Square. In the course of the Stations, we will again acknowledge the finality of the death of Jesus. Beyond the horrors of the arrest, trial and crucifixion, the story of this week is the death of Jesus. Death is again the one thing which cannot be undone; it is a series that cannot be redone; it is simply done. For the disciples, the death of Jesus was the one thing they could not change.

How much like life to present us with a personal experience that interprets the scriptures for us. Let me tell how Betty died and you will understand more than before how Jesus' died. Let me tell you about the loss of a mother-in-law and you will understand more than ever how the loss of Jesus clobbered his followers.

Good Friday screams out the finality of Jesus' death and the finality of all that Jesus meant to them. Stop. It goes no further than this. The grave is the dead end to his life and to our hopes.

...and then Easter. On Easter, God quietly rolled back the stone and called Jesus from the grave. God called Jesus from the grave to declare once and for all that God will be the final authority on life and death. No one else in all creation has the authority to stare down Old Death. God alone required the stone to stand aside and Death to give up its prize.

Then, Mary Magdalene fell on her face at the feet of Jesus, again because that is all that she could do at the undoing of the most final event in every human life. She fell on her face in worship and in wonder at the recognition of all God had done. She did not whoop! She did not sing, "Christ the Lord is Risen Today." And she surely did not shout, "Alleluia!" She fell on her face because that is all she could do.

On Easter, we will open the Alleluia Box and let our Alleluias loose again. We will sing the Easter song. We will urge Edie to turn the pipe organ loose in honor of Easter.

And we will remember the mother-in-law, the mother, the father, the brothers, the children, whom we have buried. Somewhere in the Alleluias, we will sing for them. They too will rise again! Jesus is the first and the promise. Alleluia!


