

Reflections

It is with excitement and to be honest, some anxiousness, that Nancy and I come to join you in ministry. Church Street is a church with a great past, but a future beyond our imagination.

When Andy Ferguson grew up in Church Street, he probably could not have imagined that one day he would serve here as pastor. In the spring of 1979, I was approved as a candidate for Ordained Ministry in a meeting of the Knoxville District Board of Ministry in the parlor of Church Street. I could not have imagined that one day, I would serve here as one of the pastors. Andy and I served together at Second UMC here in Knoxville years ago. He was one of the pastors in our wedding. Thirty-six years later, here we are. We could have not imagined that he would be passing the mantle to me over the past few weeks. God is so good and has wonderful plans and a great future that is hard for us to imagine. Church Street has a rich tradition and history full of effective pastors and laity working as a team.

I am excited about joining you in winning people to Christ, seeing people that others do not see, transforming lives and helping to change this corner of the world. You will quickly come to love Rev. Barbara Clark as she comes to join Matt Hampton, Nicole Krewson, Rick Isbell, Jan Buxton-Wade and myself as your clergy leadership team. Along with the wonderful staff and lay leadership, can you begin to imagine what God is going to do in our midst?


As we begin to imagine, the foundation for what is to come can only begin on our knees in prayer. A scripture that continues to challenge me is Acts 4:23 and following. The early church was challenged by the Jewish Council to keep quiet about Jesus. In fact, some like Peter and John were imprisoned for speaking boldly about Jesus. It was a most challenging time. Aren't we living in some very challenging situations today? Our hearts are still broken over what took place just two weeks ago at Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, SC. Yet, we are blessed by the sign of unity and hope in Charleston. Seeing the diversity of people unified in the name of God offering love, forgiveness and hope as they move forward through very difficult days speaks to the power of God. How can this be in the midst of such evil and tragedy? I attribute their actions to the power of gathering in prayer in the aftermath seeking God's guidance and direction.

The early church faced severe persecutions. It would have been easy for them to rebel and lash out in the face of these difficult circumstances. However, in the midst of heavy persecution, they would not be silenced. They gathered to pray. It was not a common or ordinary prayer for protection or God's help, but it was a call for something amazing. These persecuted Christians joined together and prayed for boldness in proclaiming God's word. In Acts 4:30, "Lord... Stretch out your hand with healing power; May miraculous signs and wonders be done through the name of your holy servant Jesus." In doing so, they remembered all God had done, and all God would do. They began to imagine!

As, we begin this journey together, will you join me over the next several weeks praying this prayer-*God, we give you praise and are thankful for you. Help us to imagine all that you want to do in this next season of ministry with our pastors, staff and lay leadership. Give us courage; give us boldness to imagine all that you want to do in and through us. With the Holy Spirit as our helper, we expect great things! Imagine! Amen.*

See you Sunday as I share on "It is Everything!" from 1 Corinthians 13. I know July 4th weekend is an up and down time-up in the mountains and down at the lake or ocean. If you are traveling, I am praying for your safety. Be fully present as you enjoy family and friends. If you are in town, it is a perfect time to make plans to be in worship and a good time to invite someone to come with you.
