

In 2017 the Church Street Choirs (adult & youth) will have the opportunity to travel and perform in Germany as a part of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. The trip will be open to a limited number of non-singers from the church and the greater Knoxville arts community. Covenant Bible Study Orientation Session

Covenant Bible Study is coming to Church Street. This in-depth Bible study is made up of three 8-week modules covering the entire Bible. It is conversational in nature but will require commitment, weekly study outside of class and a desire to learn how the biblical theme of covenant is a unifying pattern through all the books of the Old and New Testaments.

Each module concentrates on an aspect of the overall covenant theme. Module 1, *Creating*, concentrates on how a biblical covenant is created and established. Module 2, *Living*, centers around applying the covenant to actual relationships in everyday life. Module 3, *Trusting*, tackles how we can trust the covenant in times of loss, suffering or difficult times. Participants will read great portions of the both the Old and New Testaments, view videos of biblical scholars as they discuss the various aspects of the covenant and be in conversation with other biblical students in the class about each week’s lesson. Rev. Rick Isbell, Minister of Discipleship will facilitate each class session.

The orientation and interest session for Covenant will be on Sunday, August 23, at 4 p.m., in CLC 120. There you will see and examine the actual books, see an introductory video, and learn what is entailed in this study and each class session. If you have further questions, contact Rev. 

Reflections

Several years ago, I was in a meeting with church leaders, and we were going round and round about a particular matter. Today, I could not tell you what we were discussing and trying to make a decision on. Yet, one thing that has stuck with me since that meeting was someone spoke up and said, “We are not pouring concrete here, we can always come back and change it.” This thought has stuck with me since that time. I have used this quote a lot in my ministry as decision making takes place. What may seem so good today, in time, may not work tomorrow, next week or next year. This has been a freeing thought for me as I give leadership and share in ministry. As we pray, discuss, discern, collaborate and pray some more, the Holy Spirit leads and guides our decision making. However, if we approach life as pouring concrete, it sure makes it hard to make changes. Sometimes, we have to admit what worked yesterday does not work now. Moreover, what seemed like a good decision then is not now. There are times we step back and realize we made a mistake. If we pour concrete in decision making, it sure makes it hard to live life with one another.



This leads me to three thoughts for the days ahead. First, the Church Conference, this past Sunday, August 16, approved by 95% to move forward on the Building Committee’s recommendation concerning phase one of our Master Plan. It was a good meeting with great questions. We have wonderful trusted leaders on our Building Committee. Yet, we all need to remember that we did not approve moving forward on pouring concrete, but to take the next step toward selecting an architect, a contractor or construction manager. At some point more informational meetings will take place along with a Church Conference (all the final details included) that will give permission to pour concrete for the new building and renovations.

Secondly, we have had many discussions about church security this past week, and if you were here Sunday, you probably noticed that we had three Knoxville Police Officers who were assisting us. Many of you were pleased by this action, others concerned that it was over the top, and others were upset by their presence. All of these concerns are valid. Church staff and leadership have been wrestling over them for the last week and began this week with the same discussion. I would just remind all of us, we did not pour concrete this past Sunday around security. We learned a lot, and will continue to have discussions, and make changes along the way. Your input, patience and understanding are most helpful as we move forward. It makes a world of difference when we approach decision making around this thought of not pouring concrete. What seems so right today will change at some point in the future. The only concrete that I want to see poured here is when the foundation of the new building is constructed.

Thirdly, speaking of foundations and pouring concrete, I want to continue to pour spiritual thought into our faith foundation this Sunday as I share around the thought of “A Kairos Moment in a Chronos World.” Our scripture text is from Psalm 84.

I look forward to seeing you Sunday!
