## Reflections - Serving Our Students

I will start off this article by being completely honest with you - I am fiercely passionate about student ministry and, therefore, and unashamedly biased toward it. There is a true beauty in walking through adolescence and beyond with young people. It is an honor and a privilege to be with them as they become young men and women of faith and grow into whoever it is they may become. And, I am quite partial to the success of this type of ministry.

Over the past year or so, our youth ministry at Church Street has claimed the verse from James 1:22, "Be doers of the word, not hearers only." Our prayer has been that this little reminder would call us into action, that the lessons we learn on Sundays would not be forgotten by Monday morning. It is something that our students have reminded me of with the way they live their lives. I firmly believe that each of our youth volunteers would attest to the fact that pouring into the lives of our students has blessed them far more than they could have anticipated. From sixth through twelfth grade, Church Street's students are ministered to on a weekly basis through our educational ministries. They dig deep into the Word and build community through small groups, retreats, and fellowship opportunities. They are shown the love of Christ by having folks attend their sporting, musical, and other events. They are encouraged to grow in their faith by being in community with one another and with quality adult volunteers.

For many years, our high school students have graduated, and Church Street has not been able to offer them a healthy college program to encourage them as they move into the next stage of their lives. This is an unfortunate truth, especially considering the University of Tennessee is only a block away, and schools like Maryville College, Pellissippi State, and Lincoln Memorial being so nearby. Thanks to the work of several passionate volunteers and the support of Church Street staff, CollegeLife is up and running. Weekly Sunday School meetings, monthly luncheons, UT football tailgates, and local service projects are already happening.

We've been reminded that stewardship is a combination of faith and action: Faith + Works = Changed Lives. Each of these student ministries is at a critical juncture - they are growing and students are asking for more. In order for them to continue to feed the needs of our young people, we need your help. And we can use folks with all kinds of spiritual gifts! Are you great at providing meals? Does your home offer students a cozy place to meet from time to time? Can you share in a teaching role? Do you have the gift of organization and can help with administrative tasks or planning events? Do you love the Vols (in good times and in bad) and could host a tailgate? Are you plugged into local mission opportunities? Can you financially sponsor a student for an activity? Do you love gift giving and could fill a care package for a student away at school? Are you great at writing notes and can encourage students through the school year?

These ministries need your help to continue to thrive and share the Gospel with our students. Please consider serving with our middle school, high school, or college students.
