


Presentation On General Conference

On Sunday, June 12, at 3 p.m. in Parish Hall, Rev. Graves, along with several Holston Conference Delegation Members, will share about the recent General Conference in Portland, Oregon. This will be a regional presentation so that others may be informed. We will also hear about the upcoming Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference (July 13-15) at Lake Junaluska, NC, where the election of bishops will take place. As a part of our time on June 12, you will be given an opportunity to give a gift in support of Rev. Graves, Holston Nominee for bishop, to help in the expenses of this process. 
Sharing Shops Update



A Century Ago...

In May, 1916, as Church Streeters were observing the church's 100th anniversary and decorating their ancestors' graves on Memorial Day, they were also watching the development of WWI in Europe. Should the U.S. join the war effort? That was the debate. White women and African-Americans were not yet recognized as full citizens; but no doubt, they had their opinions and concerns for those they loved who might be called to serve. Less than a year later, the U.S. was engaged in WWI and 124 Church Streeters enlisted to serve, three of whom gave the ultimate sacrifice. Only a few years later, in WWII, 168 Church Streeters enlisted, eight of whom gave the ultimate sacrifice. Be thankful – and let us not forget those who have served or now serve.
