The BOH Food Co-Op members have become a family; we laugh together; we cry together; we pray together; we love each other. Through the birth of babies and death of loved ones, we all are fed. Without Church Street members' weekly food donations and financial support to purchase food from Second Harvest Food Bank, the BOH Food Co-Op community member would not be fed, literally or figuratively.

- *The Redemption of Scrooge* by Matt Rawle. An Advent study based on A Christmas Carol. Participant book with leader's guide and DVD, 4 sessions (NEW)
- *All I Want for Christmas: Opening the Gifts of God's Grace* by James W. Moore. Participant book with leader's guide and DVD, 5 sessions (NEW)
- *Down to Earth: The Hopes & Fears of All the Years are Met in Thee Tonight* by Mike Slaughter. Participant book with leader's guide and DVD (NEW)
- *The Wonder of Christmas: Once You Believe, Anything is Possible* by Ed Robb & Rob Renfro. Participant book with leader's guide and DVD, 4 sessions (NEW)
