Hands On Mission Project

This year once again the people of Holston Conference will be sending backpacks to the children of the Ishe Agnesu ministry in Zimbabwe. The Ishe Agnesu Project was founded by missionary Marie Humbane in Mutare, Zimbabwe and is part of the UMC's Global Ministries. It is an after-school program for children in extreme poverty (many are orphans) and offers two meals a day and assistance with homework. It also offers instruction in Christian education and values and teaches social and family values. Ishe Agnesu also provides funds to pay for tuition, fees and school uniforms. Since the program began in 1998, many students have graduated from its high school and some have gone on to attend college. For most, if not all the children, education is the only way to beak out of the cycle of poverty.

Our conference offering, Change for Children, also goes to Ishe Agnesu. This program needs \$65,000 a year to educate 45



We are collecting school kits for Ishe Agnesu in Zimbabwae. Packing list:

Our children's department has been collecting donations for this offering and we, as a congregation, are also invited to contribute to this fund.

We also thought it would be fun to make this collection into a friendly competition between the Sunday School classes! of last year, the
class has met each
Sunday for two



hours studying both the Old and New Testaments. Students have engaged in daily disciplined Bible study and reflection, reading of the student books, plus attending class each week. I have served as leader of the class.

The class sessions consisted of a video presentation, input from the leader and small group discussion on the application of scriptures to today's life. The class spent 12 weeks each studying the Old and New Testaments. We had a great time together and here are some quotes from the class participants:

"Fast Track is a very good study, especially for those who have limited time for class attendance and study. Everyone should do a directed study at some point.... Disciple Fast Track is a good way to start."
