CREED Study

The Apostles' Creed is one of the basic professions of faith in most Christian churches. It is one of the most widely used and best known confessional statements in the western Church. This fall Rev. Rick Isbell will lead a 9-week study on this foundational creed using Adam Hamilton's study, *CREED: What Christians Believe & Why* on Sundays from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. with a supper break. The study will take an in-depth look into the Apostles' Creed: God, Jesus Christ, The Holy Spirit, The Church & Communion of Saints, Forgiveness of Sins, and the Resurrection of the Body.

Participants are expected to purchase and read the study book and have a notebook for reflection notes and journaling. An orientation session for this study will be held on Sunday, August 27, 4:30 pm in room 201-A. The study will begin on Sunday, September 10. If you have questions, contact Rev. Accessibility for All

Church Street's chancel area is a magnificent and sacred place for worship. In fact, most members probably consider the chancel's main altar to be the most sacred space in the entire church. And atop its center is the "Welcoming Christ" statue, a unique, visual symbolic statement of God's unconditional acceptance and grace for all.



Powell Richardson ascended the steps to participate in communion at the main altar on Sunday, August 6. Yet, this is not about Powell. Rather, it is about demonstrating the need for choice and open access to that sacred space for all people, regardless of physical conditions.

Look around. There are those within *our very own congregation* who utilize canes and walkers and even wheelchairs to assist with ambulation for whom ascending and descending the chancel steps is not possible. Look around some more. You will see some members who normally do not require assistive devices but become unsteady on the chancel steps and cannot ascend and descend them safely. All of us in time will become more unsteady as we utilize the chancel steps. Yet, many of us have expectations of fully participating in church services even longer than our parents, for a number of reasons including better health care. As you continue to look around, you may notice members with temporary mobility issues, who require crutches, canes, and walkers. They, too, are unable to access the main altar for communion.

Yet all people – able-bodied or not – should have the same choices of places to participate in the communion sacrament and other worship. Is it right and in keeping with the scriptures to limit altar access to only the able-bodied? Access to the main, chancel altar--perhaps the most sacred space in church--should be open to all, just as the "Welcoming Christ" reminds us.

Look around again, and this time look outside our church. Did you know in just Knox County alone more than 25,000 people rely on wheelchairs, walkers, canes and other assistive equipment to walk? How many of these individuals are looking for a church in which they feel unencumbered to fully participate in worship, including access to the altar?

Powell represents so many people with mobility issues both inside and outside the church. With Church Street's new building addition underway, which brings much-needed improvements to Nave accessibility, the time is right to provide means of access to the main altar, so everyone who enters our building can fully experience and participate in worship in this magnificent and sacred place.
