Downtown Church Tours


Friday, December 21 from 5:00-7:00 p.m.

DISCIPLE PROPHETS CLASS COMPLETES STUDY

For the past 12 weeks, 12 persons have been engaged in an in-depth study of the prophets of the Old Testament and approximately 500 years of Israel's history. Beginning with the prophet Nathan (1000 BCE) and continuing through the divided kingdoms, through the exile into Assyria and Babylonia, the return to Jerusalem (539 BCE) and the rebuilding of the Temple (515 BCE), the study conclude with the last prophet in the Old Testament, Malachi.

We learned the role of the prophets in Israel's history, their messages and relevancy to today's world. This was the first of the Disciple Fast Track courses. It required daily scripture readings, reading of the study book and attendance in the 90-minute course that met on Sunday afternoons.

COMMISSION ON A WAY FORWARD

Action of Church Council

At the September meeting of Church Council, a motion was made for

Church Council to adopt the following: (for decision at the November meeting of Church Council):

"We the Church Council of Church Street United Methodist Church, in regular session on 11-27-18, do hereby request the Clergy and Lay Delegation of The Holston Annual Conference to The Called Session of The General Conference of The United Methodist Church, to be held February 23–26, 2019, to vote in favor of preserving the unity of the church


Messages are forwarded on to each member of the Holston Conference delegation. by removing the restrictive language regarding human sexuality found in the 2016 Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church. Further, we request the Delegation to vote in favor of the One Church Model as proposed by the Commission on a Way Forward and endorsed by The United Methodist Council of Bishops."

The motion was considered, debated and voted on by Church Council at its November 27 meeting. The motion was adopted by a vote of 20 to 6. Present were 31 of the 46 members of Church Council.

Further, the Church Council considered and passed a resolution to take this matter to a full Church Conference, the date for which has not been determined.

It is important to note that this resolution does not commit Church Street to do anything beyond communicating Church Council's support of the One Church Plan to the Holston Conference delegates to the Called Session of the General Conference in St. Louis in February, 2019.

STEPHEN MINISTRY—Helping Others with "Blue Holidays"

As Christmas approaches, some people are hurting due to the loss of a loved one, a difficult diagnosis, a job loss, or other significant life challenge. These losses and experiences can make an ordinarily joyful season feel hard, lonely, or even painful. Holidays can magnify unhappiness or anxiety. People may feel there is nothing to be happy about this year, or even begin to think the holidays are just making everything worse.

We can suggest some ways you may be able to help friends or family members who are grieving and finding it hard to celebrate.

- First, it is helpful and supportive to let people know it's okay to feel whatever way they are feeling.
- Give them "permission" to observe holidays in whatever way feels comfortable and right to them.

- Offer to help in specific ways. "Would you like help in decorating the tree? Could I help you with baking? Could we go shopping together?" Listen to what they need or want; don't impose your agenda or needs on them.
- Ask how they are feeling and doing, and listen to them with your heart as well as your ears. Remember that grief is personal, and there is no right timetable or right way to grieve. Be patient, giving them respect and love.
- Help them decide which traditions they want to observe and what they want to skip this year. Encourage them to take time to rest and be kind to themselves.

By relating in these ways, you can help hurting people find comfort and hope in a difficult time. Remember that Stephen Ministers are always glad to help wherever they are needed.
