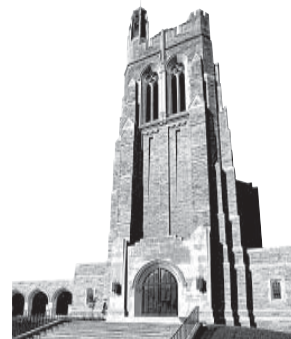

Carrie Ellis Memorial & Rasnake Scholarship applications available now ... Deadline: April 10

The Higher Education and Campus Ministry Committee is offering two college scholarships for youth and young adults who will enroll in college this fall or who are already in college.

• The **Rasnake Memorial Scholarship** (\$1,000) is open to Church Street members already in college as well as entering freshmen. NOTE: This scholarship is named for Frankie Sherman Rasnake who designated part of the largest single bequest ever given (at that time) to Church Street UMC for a scholarship endowment.



• The **Carrie Ellis Memorial Scholarship** (\$1,000) is for a high school senior who has been an active participant in Church Street's youth program and plans to attend college in the fall. NOTE: This scholarship is named for Carrie Ellis, a very active member of the youth ministry, who died in a car accident in the fall of 1993.

Parish Choir will present *Requiem* on March 27

Sunday, March 27 - 8:30 & 11 am - Nave

Gabriel Fauré's (1845-1924) *Requiem* has a unique and interesting history.

The work, in its original five-movement form, was first performed in 1887 at the Church of the Madeleine in Paris, at which Fauré was choirmaster. Its orchestration was unique for the time in that it included divided violas along with cellos and basses, but no violins! Fauré later expanded the version "for use on grander occasions" to include two additional movements, violins, horns and trumpets.

The work performed at Church Street during the Sunday worship services on March 27, will resemble the second version with seven movements and a violin solo.

The Requiem Mass text is a set of prayers for eternal rest and peace for the departed. It begins with the phrase, "Requiem aeternam, dona eis domine," or "Grant them eternal rest, O Lord." The earliest musical settings of the Requiem text were composed with simple plainchant in the medieval period.

Reflections...on Bruce Pearl situation

There is a morality play working itself out in the pages of the newspaper these days; The drama used to be confined to the sports section, but on Tuesday it spilled onto the front page. The front page of Tuesday's sports section said it all: On top: Pearl is out as head coach of the UT men's basketball team. In the middle: Lady Vols advance to the Sweet Sixteen. On the bottom: Spring practice for football opens. More details and analysis could be found inside.

Because I know you have been following these stories as closely as I have, I will not go into the details of each. However, I want to invite you to reflect on the drama that is unfolding here. Like many, you might be reacting to the news; maybe you have joined a march in support of Coach Pearl. Like me, you may have grumbled about the poor timing of these colliding events. These reactions are also part of the unfolding drama. (Maybe we could write a play and present it in our river front amphitheater on the afternoon of Boomsday.)

The drama would be a lesson in morality, honesty, and the value of following the rules. It would continue with

lessons in hard work and staying focused despite the distractions. Act III would have lessons on the hope that moves us to keep up the hard work.

Finally, we would present the conclusion of the drama. Unfortunately, the conclusion could not demonstrate the net being cut down at the end of the tournament or the presentation of the championship trophy. Despite our passions,

that really is the minor and transient point of athletics (and life). The conclusion's big point would demonstrate the kind of people we have become because of the endeavors to which we have applied ourselves. It is those who have kept the big point in sight who come to the end of each season with a clear conscience and real anticipation for the next season. (Hmm... Sounds a lot like living as a reflective Christian.)

So far, I do not have an orange stole for my pulpit robe. Orange has not been recognized as one of the liturgical colors of the church year. If the drama next door continues (along with its lessons), we may have to ask for an additional color for our Sunday mornings.
