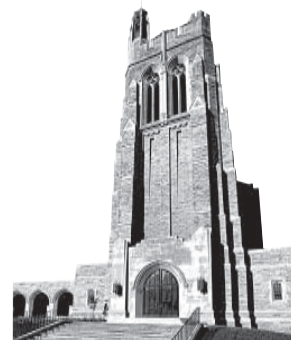

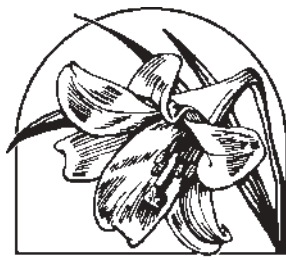

Did you know... *Easter Lily Legends*

- For many, the beautiful trumpet-shaped white flowers symbolize purity, virtue, innocence, hope and life—the spiritual essence of Easter.
- The lily has long symbolized the Resurrection. According to legend, when Jesus walked the earth, all the plants and animals — beautiful and not so beautiful — bowed their heads in respect. The lily, however, considered itself too beautiful and proud to bow. After the Crucifixion, the lily was so ashamed it bowed its head and continues to do so as a sign of respect.
- Often called the “white-robed apostles of hope,” lilies were found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ’s agony. Tradition has it that the beautiful white lilies sprung up where drops of Christ’s sweat fell to the ground in his final hours of sorrow and deep distress. Churches continue this tradition at Easter time by banking their altars and surrounding their crosses with masses of Easter Lilies, to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and hope of life everlasting.
- A mark of purity and grace throughout the ages, the regal white lily is a fitting symbol of the greater meaning of Easter. Gracing millions of homes and churches, the flowers embody joy, hope and life. Whether given as a gift or enjoyed in your own home, the Easter Lily serves as a beautiful reminder that Easter is a time for rejoicing and celebrating.

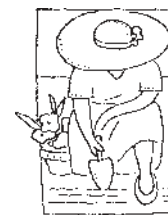

Reflections...on Church Street at Worship

The sign out front says: Sunday Worship 8:30 am, but it really begins earlier—about 7:15 or maybe a bit before. Walt is first, coming into the Nave turning on lights and checking to make sure the church is ready. Soon, each pastor comes in from the hallway, turns left toward the chancel steps, and stops, looking toward the altar, to take it all in. It is not as if we have never seen the Nave early in the morning. We see it every Sunday and several times through the week. And yet, no one can enter that space unthinking, unaware of its single purpose. One by one the pastors enter, pause to reverence this place, then move about taking care of preparations.

There are others with jobs to do. Edie checks on the pipe organ and gets her music in order. The Altar Guild stopped by earlier in the week to check a hundred details. On communion Sundays, the stewards hurry back and forth with trays and cloths, squinting at the altar until they are sure Darryll will nod in approval.

The people who come to worship are different depending on when they arrive.

The first arrive around 8:00 am, and mostly come in reverence. With the most time to chat, they almost never spend the time talking. They carefully, or out of habit, locate one seat out of 800 open seats. Then, these early ones sit in tacit reverence.

The punctual people arrive in the Nave around 8:15. The ushers are suddenly in place, greeting and (occasionally saluting) each one that follows. Teenagers have made a beeline for the Choir Room; their parents had time to walk the distance down the hall to find the Nave ready for worship.

The acolytes can be seen practicing the special movements for today's service. The Bible must be held this way; the cross must be lifted higher. There isn't much time, but they won't be allowed to retreat to the safety of other teenagers until Sarah gives the OK.

Now, the visitors are arriving at the Narthex. They rarely come through the breezeway; they have been trained to enter a new church through the front doors.

There is a tentative quality to the way visitors find their places. They have all heard the stories of the unwitting visitor sitting in the seat of some established stalwart of the church. And they wonder if they will find welcome or a glare as the established owner discovers them in their place.

By 8:20, the pastors are back, greeting. A pat on the shoulder to welcome a regular. A hug to welcome another one back to church. Families with kids are hurrying through the hallway door by now. The kids know the regular spot; they know who sits near, and they look for familiar faces. There is a buzz to the nave that defies anyone who expected subdued stillness; we are too close to starting time for silence.

Then, at 8:25 the chimes in the tower ring. It's time for announcements: Who's in the hospital? Are you sure that's all? Did someone get married this weekend? A plug for a Sunday afternoon event.

Finally, "Christ is risen!" "Christ is risen indeed!" Edie has made her way unseen to the organ console. The sound of the organ fills the nave. One by one we have become voices in a community which does "church." And Easter Sunday worship has begun!
