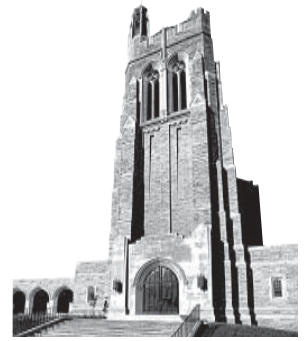

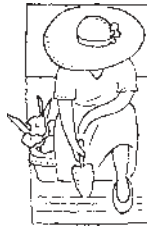

The **Hunger Helper Market**, started in 1977, raises money through the sale of vegetables, flowers, fruit and baked goods. These items, grown and made by Church Street members, are sold "market style" in the breezeway on Sunday mornings. You participate by donating produce, flowers, etc., and buying what others have shared. Money raised will benefit various hunger projects in our area and beyond.

If there is enough interest, more classes may be offered in the future.

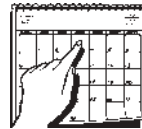

## Reflections...

The coming of a baby into the family has given me a new way of looking at the familiar Easter (and earlier, the Christmas) story. As our children have reached adulthood, the very personal quality of the Savior, Jesus, has faded. According to the scriptures, "It was necessary" that Jesus should die for the people. With that impersonal statement, I had given Jesus a task and nodded with approval that he completed it—regardless of the cost of his life. So we all learn to watch the passion story from an impassionate distance.

But to anticipate a newborn child last Christmas was to see the coming of Jesus in very personal, even visceral terms. To hold your child now at Easter is to know stirrings in the heart that Jesus' mother, Mary, and Joseph, if living, must have known at the crucifixion and later at the news of the resurrection.

How deeply God works in the human heart! Deeper than words can express. More personal than your closest

friendship. Mary, standing at the cross, saw the man she had borne, giving his life for the sin of the world. I can now imagine her standing near the cross, saying, "That's not just another man doing what is 'necessary,' that is my child!"

Can we also imagine God watching on the day of crucifixion, watching over the edge of heaven at the sufferings of God's only begotten Son? There the resplendent glory of God stands subdued, God saying over and over, "That's not just another man doing what is 'necessary,' that is my child!"

Can we also sense the stirrings of our hearts at the call of Jesus? Our impersonal "contracts" or "arrangements" do not have the depth to name the deeply personal call Jesus places upon our lives. Christianity is not a life-style choice; it is a personal and life-changing loyalty to Jesus Christ.
