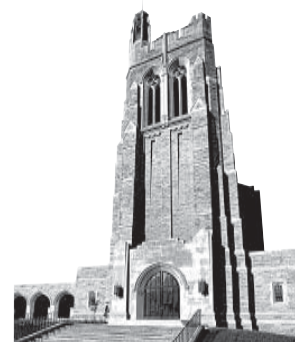

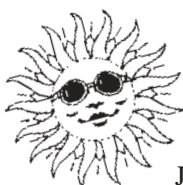

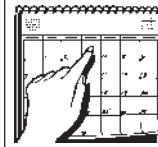

Annual Conference concludes...

Following the theme, *Christ for the World*, clergy and lay members (and many others) representing 899 churches in east Tennessee, southwest Virginia and north Georgia assembled on Sunday, June 12, at Lake Junaluska, NC, with Bishop James E. Swanson, Sr., presiding. The four days were filled with meetings, presentations, music and worship.

• This Annual Conference will be remembered for many, many ballots – as delegates to both the 2012 General and Jurisdictional Conferences were elected. The continual balloting was even highlighted during Charles Maynard's annual closing "Humorous Look at Annual Conference."

• The **Hands-On Mission Project** team reported that 28 tons of supplies, valued at a little less than \$200,000, are bound for Liberia and Zimbabwe. All 12 districts exceeded their goals. **Thanks to Church Streeters who compiled and completed 100 health kits that will be delivered to Liberia.**

• The **Memorial Service** on Monday evening celebrated the lives of those conference-related persons who had died since the last annual conference and included two Church Streeters: **Charles Burnett** (Clergy member) and **Betty Williams** (Surviving Clergy Spouse).

• Former Church Streeter, **Rev. Janet Edwards**, was ordained Elder. She has been pastor serving the Sevierville Circuit and will be moving to the Liberty Hill / Edwards Chapel charge in the Morristown District this week.

Don't Take a Vacation from Church



Reflections...

Summer is the time for daydreams. It was Joel the prophet who elevated dreams to the gates of heaven. “Then afterward I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions” (Joel 2.28). Note to sixth graders: The next time you get called down in class for daydreaming, just remind the teacher that your preacher told you that daydreams are God’s idea.

We spend a lot of time in church hearing stories of God’s call to works of all kinds. On Pentecost, we heard about the gift of the Holy Spirit so that the Church might have the same power that was in Jesus. It is time to bring this conviction together with God’s gift of dreams for what-might-be.

Summer is the time when we dream what might happen in the years ahead as we are faithful to God’s call. Later in fall, we have budgets to set and reports to write; there is little time to explore our dreams for the future. About one month from now, the program staff of the church will travel to Sterchi Lodge to plan and dream about the future of our church.

This is your time to talk about your dreams for the future of our church. If

we are faithful, what might we do in Christ’s name? You know, sometimes the thing that bothers you most is God’s call to respond. What have you been worried or troubled about lately? What have you seen on your travels this summer that excites you?

At Annual Conference, Bishop Swanson presented what he calls: “The Call to Action.” It is born out of concern that the church is not as effective at making disciples of Jesus



Christ as we are called to do. The Call to Action is the plan to “re-order the life of the church” for its disciple-making mission. As a staff, we will study this to see what we are being asked to do. As a church, we need to see the concern that the Bishops are seeing.

In the coming month, please share your dreams for Church Street United Methodist Church. I will be collecting these and will work with them as we plan for Staff Retreat.

One other note: as you travel about this summer, I hope you will worship wherever you are. Please bring me the bulletin from that church. I would love to see what that church was doing.
