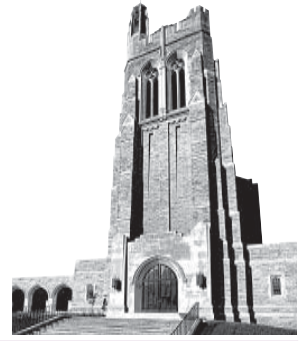

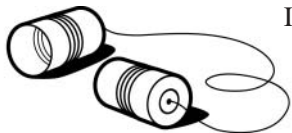

Reflections...on the Healing Service

Last Sunday at the morning worship services, we held what we called “the Healing Services.” Not many United Methodist churches hold healing services. Nobody else holds them in the middle of summer. Each time I have mentioned to other clergy the morsel that we were going to have this at Church Street; the immediate response is raised eyebrows: “You are?” Well, yes. We did last Sunday.

As it turned out, I stayed at the chancel steps to greet people after the service while others made their way to the chapel for prayer. At both services, the line of people waiting to pray extended down the chapel aisle and lasted well after the Postlude was over. As I result, I did not get to meet anyone in the chapel for prayer. I can tell you that the pastors, Sarah, Darryll, and Colleen, who were in the chapel for prayer were humbled and moved by the experience of praying with the people of the church.

What I heard while greeting people in the nave after the service were the “BTW’s of a Sunday morning.” For those who have not entered the texting world, these are the “By The Way’s of a Sunday morning. “Nice sermon preacher and By

the Way, I want you to know...” There at the chancel steps, I learned a lot about the weeks that stand before us: challenges, worries, joys, and trips to manage.

I tell you this because pastors, like all of us, care deeply about walking through the challenges of life with you — and all the people of the congregation. The first reason is that we tend to be a pretty tender-hearted bunch. We care

about the people of this church and what is happening — in public and out of sight.

The second reason is that by our presence we stand as the reminder that

the big moments of every life are lived before God. Going to the hospital is not a Jonah moment where we go so far from home that even God cannot find us. Just the opposite! There in the hospital, in court, or wherever, is the place God most surely meets us. Pastors stand as a reminder of this healing conviction.

So, thank you for your response to the healing service. As a result, these pastors have more to do than ever — and happily so. You are — each one in the congregation is — always in our prayers. Let us continue to pray for one another.

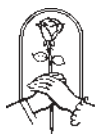
