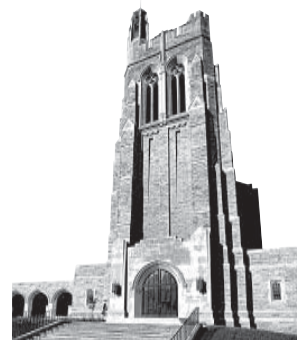

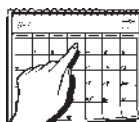

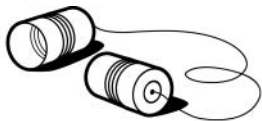
Pastoral care is an important responsibility of the clergy at our church; however, when members are hospitalized and the pastors are not notified, they are unable to provide support.

Getting the Word Out!

Continuing from our list in the previous *Messenger*, we are highlighting the many ways that our congregation and community find out about Church Street news. Below are additional options for communicating:

- **The Messenger**, our weekly newsletter, is the #1 vehicle for news. However, other newsletters are available, such as SingleVision, UMW Newsletter, etc. These arrive at your home via snailmail, are emailed to you if you are part of the particular email distribution and can be accessed via the church website (News & Events / Newsletters).

- **Advertising & Press Releases**

One of the main ways that we communicate to the community is through advertising in a number of local newspapers and publications, as well as occasional TV or radio commercials

- **Brochures, etc.**

Not every event or program needs a brochure; however, we use brochures, postcards, flyers and other mailings to help us get the word out to our congregation and the community.

- **Banners on church grounds**

Several children came to this year's VBS solely because they saw the event banner on the grounds. Plus, many of our Walk Through Bethlehem attendees mention that they heard about the event by seeing the banner.





“Reflections...on my summer at Church Street”

Almost three months ago, I pulled out of the driveway and wondered where in the world I was going. I knew my final destination and had the map of exactly how to get there, but I didn't quite know what to expect.

If you've asked me about my calling or heard it from someone else, you'd know that it wasn't exactly an “ah-ha- moment.” It was years of wrestling with God about what service and ministry look like – in all shapes and forms, inside and outside of the church. I ventured through internships at domestic violence shelters and juvenile courthouses, all to find myself driving toward Knoxville on my way to Church Street.

But this summer wasn't a final destination. It's been another stop along

that map - a place to be shaped, to grow, to take root, and to sprout wings. I've experienced things this summer I never expected to face before I was out of divinity school - before I was actually



“the pastor.” Not only have Andy, Sarah, and Darryll trusted me to serve in these capacities, but many of the congregants, each of you, have enabled me to enter into your lives not only as summer intern but, in some ways, truly as pastor. It is because of you that I've had the chance to grow tremendously these past few months, seeing ministry as I never have before.

I sincerely thank you for your hospitality. And know that my experiences this summer will continue to shape me throughout my journey in ministry.

Next rotation of *Four Course Fellowship* begins in September...Sign-up on Aug. 14 & 21

The next 4-month rotation of **Four Course Fellowship**, Church Street's “Dinner Club” opportunity, begins in September. Groups are established and locations, appetizers, salads, entrees and desserts rotate within the group on a monthly basis.

• **Here's how it works:** You sign up (with a spouse, relative or friend) and are placed in an 8-person group to share a meal and fellowship. Your group gets together once a month (for four months). The days and times of the meals are determined by your group to be convenient for all eight persons.

The host pair provides meat, beverage and home; the second pair provides appetizer and vegetable; the third pair provides salad and bread; and the fourth pair provides dessert. Each month a different 2-person team in your group becomes the host pair, and all pairs rotate the portion of the meal for which they are responsible.

• **Here's how to sign up:** Stop by the breezeway on Sundays, August 14 & 21, before and after Sunday school. You may also contact Julia Kelley at 228-0554 (cell) or jkelly2306@bellsouth.net by Sunday, Aug. 21. Again, **deadline is Aug. 21.**
