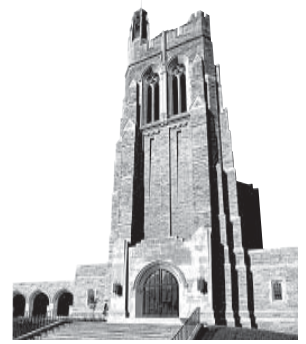

Profits from the meal will benefit the Thanksgiving Love Basket project.

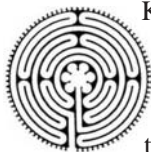
Ticket Costs

“Reflections...”

The economic world seems to lurch from one mess to an even greater mess. If the economic meltdown of 2008 was not enough, this inter-connected world of 2011 seems to be headed toward another. The recent debt ceiling and deficit reduction package was apparently not enough for the unseen “markets.” So, now the stock market is moving down; Europe is scrambling to shore up its weakest members; and “confidence” has gone AWOL.

After you call your broker, may I suggest that you consult the Scriptures? In Psalm 80, we find a lament. Now, the modern understanding of a lament is merely a passionate expression of grief. But, the Bible has a much richer sense of lament.

Certainly, a Biblical lament like this one begins with a passionate expression of grief. But, that is just the beginning. The laments of the Bible speak of God’s faithfulness across the generations; they speak of the greatness and goodness of God. They speak at length about the loss the nation is suffering. Finally, they return to the greatness of God and the confidence that God will restore.

The laments of the Bible were written during the economic downturns of

ancient Israel, during wars that would never end, during seasons of distress and worry. They have much to teach us about God’s presence in this world.

The story is told that during the days of Noah, the people were doing evil day and night. The Almighty got so fed up with their evil that he turned them over to



the full consequences of it: war, disease, famine. To cap it all, the Almighty sent 40

days of rain to wash them and all their evil away. When the evil, no-account people were all washed away, the angels of heaven let out a shout of victory. There were high-fives and dancing all around. Then, one of the angels noticed the Almighty standing away from the dancing angels; there were tears on God’s cheeks. The angel was confused: “But God, Noah is safe on the ark and the bad people are washed away. That’s what you wanted, right?” But, God could only weep: “They were my children, too.”

God walks with us in this time of worry. The unemployed, those who have lost their savings in the last few days, the Greeks on the verge of default, the traders on Wall Street, even the members of congress are God’s children.
