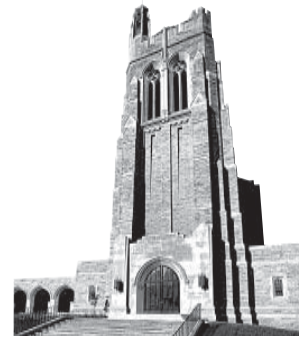

Dr. Fleming's lectures enough to invite him back for 14 years! For those who do not know who he is, the brief information below will help.

Dr. Fleming is currently the Founder and Executive Director of the Explorations in Antiquity Center in LaGrange, GA, which offers full-scale archaeological replicas from biblical times, multi-media presentations, conferences and other educational experiences. He is a foremost archaeologist, scholar and teacher. Jim has been directly involved in 9 major excavations in Israel, and many of his findings have been published.

Dr. Fleming holds a Ed.D degree from Southwestern Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, TX with doctoral minors in Biblical Archaeology and Biblical Theology. He has written extensively, with more than 25 published works appearing in *Biblical Archaeological Review*, *The Oxford Study Bible*, and *Biblical Review*. From 1969 to present, he has traveled all over the world teaching and lecturing.

“Reflections...on Commitment Sunday”

One of my teachers years ago said to me: “A good commitment Sunday is like a good revival.” I was shocked when he first said that. Revivals are spiritual, after all. Revivals are times of renewal. Revivals lead the people of the church into the presence of God. He heard all my protests and said, “Yes, I agree entirely.” Then, in response to my confused look he went on: “A good commitment Sunday is everything you just said. I agree. Don’t ever think that stewardship commitment Sunday is only about the budget.”

This Sunday is our stewardship commitment Sunday. The budget only exists in draft form; it waits for our commitments. What will happen in this service is all about the church at its spiritual best; It will be a time of renewal; it will surely lead us into the presence of God.

According to the news, this is a worrisome time in the world. The Presidential election campaign is in full swing. The nations of the world lurch from crisis to crisis. The weather keeps setting all the wrong records. If you listen to the news, this is a time to worry. But, I call on us to walk in the confidence of Children of God – for so we are. The world has much to worry about, but God is still watching over us. The world does not know the future, but we know that our destiny is in God’s hands. This is a time for confident hope.

I hope you will spend time talking with your family about your stewardship. Then, come on Sunday prepared to dedicate your pledge to God’s glory and service. It’s going to be a time of renewal; it will be a spiritual time; it will lead us into God’s presence. On Sunday, church is going to feel like a revival.
