Contact Charlotte LaFevor (521-0268) for instructions. Stock transfers go to church accounts at either Charles Schwab or Fidelity Investments, Inc. Making such transfers without prior notification to our Business Office complicates our accounting process and possibly, with market volatility, lowers the church's return on the sale of stock.

Sunday evening meal cost to increase

As I walk through the kitchen, I can't help but feel blessed that the Lord has brought me to Church Street...with new faces that have become new friends and a new kitchen that feels like home. I want to thank you for making my transition here so inviting and easy.

Upon recommendation from the Food Services Committee, the Church Council approved a cost increase, effective January 1st, for Sunday night suppers to \$6.50 for youth/adults and \$4 for children. All other meal costs remain the same. Thank you for understanding the need for this change due to the increasing cost of food. Also, if you have dishes or serving dishers left in the kitchen, please come and pick them up.

Once again, thank you for making me and my staff feel like we are home.
