Nathan Malone projected next Knoxville **District Superintendent**

Bishop James Swanson recently announced the projected appointment of Rev. Nathan Malone as Knoxville District Superintendent replacing Dr. Douglas R. Fairbanks, Jr. Dr. Fairbanks is projected to continue his ministry in the Chattanooga

District as Senior Pastor for First Centenary UMC. All ministerial appointments will be confirmed at the Holston Annual Conference in June.

(2001-2007); Concord, associate (1997-2001); First Hillsville (1992-1997); Hardins Chapel (1989-1992); Greeneville Circuit (1988-1989); and Ducktown-Crofts Chapel (1985-1988). He graduated from Candler School of Theology in 1988.

"I know there are many signs of vitality already evident throughout this district on behalf of our Lord Jesus Christ." Malone said. "I will seek to celebrate those ministries and share those stories so as to inform and encourage other congregations."

"My first goal is to simply get to know the people who are the churches of the Knoxville District, along with each of the pastors and their families. I will seek a balance of support and accountability for both pastors and congregations. We all need someone who cares enough about us to both encourage us and challenge us."

"Most of all, I will invite all of us as Christians to be diligent in nurturing our relationship with the Holy Spirit who is God. As Jesus taught us, if we will really learn to love God with everything we are and learn to love people as he showed us, our vitality will cease to be an issue."

Rev. Malone and his wife Vicki will reside in the district parsonage in Fountain City. They have two adult children. Matthew is 24 and is a drummer for the Christian band "On the Bright Side" in Knoxville. Becca is 21 and is a third-year nursing student at UTK.

I am increasingly aware that the work of Christ's Church is different from the work of the world. The world must tend to the work of business with its focus on profit and loss. The world must tend to the work of politics, each party

carefully defining itself lest the opposing party define it. The work of the world defines it even as it invites us to make our lives in the world of work and politics.

The Church is defined by the Table of Jesus Christ. It is defined by the Lord who served at the Table.

The Lord stands at the table inviting people, good, bad and indifferent, to join him in holy meal. American Christians have too long assumed that there are people Jesus has given up on: people of enemy nations, people of other religions, people of other races, people who come here illegally, people with mean-looking tattoos. We forget that this is the Jesus who was criticized for sharing meals with -Andy Ferguson, senior pastor

tax collectors and prostitutes. Jesus is anxious to invite all people to this table.

The Lord stands at the table serving everyone who willingly came to the meal. During Lent, I was reminded that on the night Jesus was betrayed, he served Judas

who betrayed him, Peter who denied him, and all the rest who ran to save themselves. We expect Jesus would serve those who are loyal, who are brave, who are

ready to serve with him. But, Jesus served even those who would turn away from him. We have something to learn about the character of serving from him.

The Church is defined by the Table where Christ serves us in Holy Communion. Thus, this Church must stand in this city as a Beacon for Christ, set on this hill: Living Christ, Teaching Christ, Offering Christ. We offer the light of Christ to this world – calling the people of the world to a higher, holier life than business or politics or good intentions can imagine.
