Dr. James Fleming serves as Director of Biblical Resources Study Center (BRSC), an ecumenical organization serving Christians around the world. Biblical Resources also produces audio-visual aids for teaching Bible history, geography, archaeology and theology.

Dr. Fleming lived and worked in Israel from 1974 to 2006, where he founded and directed the World of the Bible Archaeological Museum and Pilgrim Center in Jerusalem. Dr. Fleming has established the Explorations in Antiquity Center, a similar archaeological museum in LaGrange, Georgia that opened in June 2006.

He holds an Ed.D. degree from Southwestern Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Texas. Dr. Fleming has also taught classes in the School for Overseas Students at Hebrew University in Israel.

Dr. Fleming's lectures weave four perspectives to help us understand Biblical times—**Archaeology, History, Geography, and Theology.** He uses an ecumenical approach to suggest implications of old and recent discoveries for faith journeys of students.

Through his lectures, you embark on a journey to the ancient lands of the Bible and learn of new discoveries of ancient manuscripts that have added significantly to our understanding of the events, hopes and fears of the people in various Biblical periods.

Dr. Fleming makes extensive use of slides showing geography, culture, and archaeological discoveries in biblical lands. These bring us close to the lives of the ancient teachers and prophets, and to the peoples that heard Jesus.
