He is a Grammy-nominated singer/songwriter for Whitney Houston, Take 6, and Bishop T.D. Jakes, and travels the country speaking to businesses as a member of the National Speakers Association. Hallerin has been in the radio business for over 20 years, is married to wife Nedra, and has two children, Hallerin II and Halle Nicole.

February 3, 6 p.m. – “Future Development in Downtown Knoxville”

David Dewhirst, founder of Dewhirst Properties, is perhaps downtown Knoxville’s most vigorous preservationist and developer of recent years. He and his firm have been a vital part of renovation and development in Knoxville for the past decade.

David grew up in a suburb of Chicago, where his father was an FBI agent; the family moved to East Tennessee in the mid-1970s, when he was 13. They lived in Knoxville while his parents fixed up an antebellum farmhouse in Decatur, Tennessee, but eventually moved to the farm property, where Dewhirst would help drive the tractor, pull stumps and put up hay.

David makes his home in South Knoxville, which has an Amish barn moved from Indiana on his property there. David will be speaking on “Future Development in Downtown Knoxville.”

March 3, 6 p.m. – “The Love Kitchen”

In 1984, Helen Ashe first dreamed of creating a program to serve the needy of Knoxville. One day as she was watching television, she saw a soup line operated by Church Street United Methodist Church and she knew then what her mission was to be. Her twin sister, Ellen Turner, quickly shared in her excitement and joined in her new quest.

Helen and Ellen’s dream became a reality in the basement of a small church in February 1986. The first day **The Love Kitchen** opened its doors, they served 22 meals. Today, this amazing group prepares over 2,000 meals each week with more than eighty percent of these meals being delivered to homebound recipients.

The Love Kitchen provides meals, clothing and emergency food packages to homebound, homeless and unemployed persons. They work with local agencies to provide meals, secure used clothing, and donate services in the hope of promoting the self-sufficiency of those they serve. The organization has no paid staff; all donations go to those who need it most. The ultimate goal is to provide nourishment for anyone who is hungry and to establish a community center to serve as a safe haven supporting area children and their families.

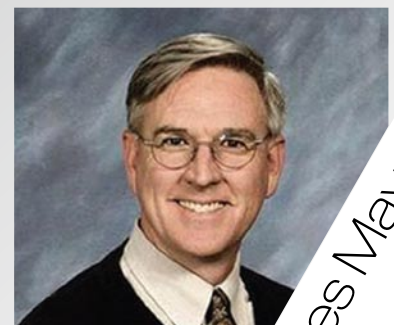
April 7, 6 p.m. – “An Appalachian Quilt of Stories”
