The Church Street Youth Choir will return from Choir Tour later this week. Fifty-four youth and adults traveled to Philadelphia for the annual Parish Youth Choir Tour. The choir sang Sunday, June 2, at America's oldest Methodist church building, St. George's UMC, in downtown Philadelphia.

The choir sang at many other locations throughout their trip and explored Philadelphia and New York City as well. The group was housed at Eastern University for each of the six nights. This Sunday, June 9, they will present the music from their tour at both services. Please join us for this special time of music as the choir showcases their talents.

Summer Elective Series Begins Sunday, June 16

Dr. Phillip Sherman will present a summer adult elective series on the **Dead Sea Scrolls** on Sundays, June 16, 23 and 30 in Parish Hall during the Sunday School hour. The series will explore the history of the discovery and delayed publication of the Scrolls, as well as explore what the Scrolls have to teach us about ancient Judaism, the origins of Christianity and the history of the text of the Bible. Dr. Phillip Sherman is Assistant Professor of Religion at Maryville College and a member of Church Street. The summer elective series will continue on July 7 with Grant Standefer, Executive Director of Compassion Coalition, to speak on "Hope Blossoms When We Claim Our Role as Salt & Light in Our Community." Then on July 14, Jim Harb, a native of Knoxville with a Christian Palestinian heritage who has been active in efforts toward peace in the Middle East for 40 years, will speak on, "Hope Springs Eternal in the Land of Milk and Honey." Classes or individuals may choose to come to part or all of the sessions from June 16 through July 14.

I was 19 years old when White Oak United Methodist Church took a chance on me and hired me as their youth director 25 years ago. Just a week or so after hiring me a church member let me borrow their conversion van and we loaded up several youth, their luggage, and a few volunteers and headed to Resurrection. It is hard to believe that it has been 25 years since my journey as a youth director began.

In 1996 I took a big leap of faith and moved from Chattanooga to Knoxville to become the youth director at Church Street UMC. I have no doubt that it was a decision orchestrated by God from beginning to end. You can ask any of those involved in the interviewing and hiring process and they will agree. I have been at Church Street for almost 17 years and have been blessed far beyond what I deserve in those years.

Two years ago I began a graduate program at the University of Tennessee to study Instructional Technology. The program combined my experience in education and interest in technology. I graduated just a few weeks ago with a Master's Degree. What started out as just an interest began to take on shape, and form a more definite direction for my future. As a result, my plans for the future have shifted.

After much prayer and consideration, I have decided to step aside as youth director at Church Street UMC. This is not an easy decision in any way, shape, or form; yet I believe it is the right decision for me and in the long run will be the best decision for youth ministry at Church Street.

I will be taking a job with South College helping faculty members implement technology in their classrooms and in their coursework. I will also be teaching as adjunct faculty. I am excited about these possibilities, but at the same time very sad about leaving the work that I have loved at Church Street.

Jenny Darden, our youth intern of three years, has been named interim youth director and will begin in that role right away. It is also vital that parents and volunteers continue in the same committed fashion that they always have, if not more. We have the best volunteers in all of United Methodism, and Church Street will need you more now than ever before. Just so you know, all summer programming will go on as planned.

Finally, I want to make it perfectly clear that I am not leaving the position of youth director because I am unhappy in any way. I love the youth of Church Street very much. I work with the best volunteers there are. I have incredibly willing parents. The pastors at Church Street are very supportive. The staff is a joy to work with and the congregation has consistently shown through word and deed that youth ministry is a priority for the church as a whole. My decision to leave is solely a personal one based on the direction of the second half of my professional career.

After almost 17 years as youth director at Church Street UMC, I am leaving with enough memories and relationships to last me a lifetime. I am truly blessed. Thank you.
