

Reflections

Grace and peace to all of you at Church Street,

My name is Nicole Marie Krewson and I will be serving as your new part-time Associate Pastor. My main ministry focus will be coordinating the Stephen Ministry program at Church Street, and you will also find me very involved in the worship life of the congregation. I am an ordained Elder in Full Connection with the Holston Conference and have been serving in the conference since 2004. I previously served at Abingdon United Methodist and Keith United Methodist as an Associate Pastor. I took a year of family leave last conference year in order to move closer to family and to be available to help care for several family members who are dealing with ongoing health issues.

Knoxville is my home. I was raised in South Knoxville and graduated from South-Doyle High School in 1997. My home church is Mountain View UMC in South Knoxville. I attended church with my grandfather who was a life-long Methodist. Volunteer Treasurer Needed at Montgomery Village Ministry

The Montgomery Ministry Board is looking for a volunteer Treasurer. This Christian ministry has been working at Montgomery Village housing project in Vestal for many years. Church Street has been a partner in this ministry since it began.

The volunteer Treasurer works with a hired bookkeeper, and takes the material from the bookkeeper and summarizes it in monthly reports to the board. The Treasurer has authority to sign checks. The position would require meeting with the bookkeeper twice a month for about 45 minutes and attending a board meeting once a month on the fourth Monday for about 90 minutes. Some small amount of time would be required to review bank statements and invoices.
