He received a GRAMMY Award in 2011 for his work conducting the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra. Richman recently announced he will conclude his tenure with the KSO following the 2014-2015 season. Richman will conduct the Church Street Parish Adult Choir along with the KSO Chamber Orchestra and the Knoxville Chamber Choir at the next Master Arts concert on Thursday, October 10, at 7:30 p.m. in the Nave. Tickets will be available at SNL.

Reflections

We had visitors at the church last week. My job was to give them a tour of the building and tell them a bit about the history of the church. It happened to be Thursday morning so there was a class from the community on the second floor. On the first floor, Soup Kitchen was buzzing with preparations. In the CLC, the Kay Center participants were arriving. Through the windows, we could see the children already busy in the Preschool. Of course, the office was filled with people needing directions or copies or answers. The visitors finally commented: “This is a pretty busy place!” Well, of course.

May I suggest that on Sunday -- or any morning you arrive at Church Street -- you walk slowly on your way to worship or Sunday School or that important meeting? Walk more slowly than usual so you can look around to see what there is to see at Church Street?

This church is meeting needs of the hungry. It is helping families with elders and children get through their days. This church offers places for the community to gather as needed. At the center of it all, this church gathers for worship. As we gather to worship the greatness and goodness of God, we remember who we are and what we are called to be.

Walk slowly through the church so you catch it, so you can be part of it, too.

This is the reason we tell the story of Christian stewardship. This is the reason we bring our tithes and offerings to this place. This is the reason – because God’s work is being done in this place each day.
