

Service of Compline

For centuries, the close of the monastic day has been the office of Compline, a time of prayer before sleep. This sung service includes Psalms, petitions, hymns, and other music, ending the day in prayerful meditation. Join us on Sunday, November 10, at 9 p.m. in the Nave as the men's ensemble, Orison, will make its debut performance as part of the Church Street Master Arts Series in a Service of Compline. Here's what to expect at the service:



- A service late in the day – historically, Compline is the final church service of the day, that's why it's at 9 p.m.

- A time for quietness and reflection – there will be no speaking; you will participate by listening

and praying along with the Psalms. You will hear mostly chanted unison singing, along with a couple of motets (selections sung in parts) by the twelve men's voices. With only one exception, the service is sung in English.

- A dimly lit Nave – the lights will be on low and there will be votive candles all around the Nave. There are no printed bulletins or programs.
- A multi-sensory service – you will experience the smoke of burning incense, which is interpreted as a symbol of the prayer of the faithful rising to heaven. You'll hear the random ringing of the tower bells to indicate the beginning and ending of the service.

Church Council To Hear Parish Hall Report

Several months ago, the Board of Trustees established an exploratory committee to look at updating the Parish Hall. Many meetings, surveys and conversations later, the exploratory committee is ready to report to the Trustees their recommendations. Being excited about their work, they have asked to follow their presentation to the Trustees with a report at the November Church Council meeting. Along with a report, they will make a recommendation and ask approval on next steps.

The report will include a vision for the future of Parish Hall, a larger scope and a recommendation to proceed further. Going further will include the services of an architect. This will begin a timeline, which will stretch over many months.

Because this is an important report, it will occupy the largest part of the meeting. Other items may be addressed depending on the remaining time.

This Church Council meeting will be one week early on Tuesday, November 19, at 6:30 p.m. in the chapel. Members of the Council and interested members of the church are invited to attend.

The November General Meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 12, at 11 a.m. in the Chapel. Our meeting will include a brief memorial service during which we recognize the following Church Street UMW members who have died since last November: Esther Bare, Nellie Dancer, Beverly Dawson, Alma Denton, Carolyn Foster, and Boots Shuman.

In addition, we will be collecting for our World Thank offering and our Penny & a Prayer offering during the service. Rev. Ashley Helton will be with us to deliver a meditation after our recognition service. Then we will gather for a potluck soup lunch in Parish Hall hosted by the UMW Executive Committee.

Just breathe...

We enter now the last two weeks before the Holiday Crazies of Thanksgiving/Black Friday/Advent/Christmas, requiring our total commitment to shopping/decorating/wrapping, punctuated with parties/services/programs of all kinds, all the while maintaining all the usual responsibilities for school and work. It all starts (roughly) on November 23; this is the Saturday before Thanksgiving Week. I feel a bit shaky just writing it all down.

As we begin this morning, just breathe. Take a few minutes to catch your breath. Take a few minutes to think. Refuse to allow panic to rule this season. Spend a few minutes deciding what will be really important to do. While you are at it, decide what might be nice but could be missed if necessary.

This is a long season of giving thanks. Based in the harvest, it looks at the barns and granaries filled with the work of the year with a thankful eye. The feast of Thanksgiving only works because we are blessed to live in this good land. The gift giving we do at Christmas only works because we have enough and enough to share.

This is a season of re-enacting the story of Christ's birth. In some mystical sense, we too are watching our flocks by night.
