

Four-Course Fellowship begins in January Sign-up deadline Sunday, December 22

The next 4-month rotation of Four-Course Fellowship begins in January, and you can be a part of it. In this fellowship opportunity, groups will be established and locations, appetizers, salads, entrees and desserts will rotate monthly within the group.

Here's how it works: You sign up (with a spouse, relative or friend) and are placed in an eight-person group to share a meal and fellowship. Your group gets together once a month (for four months). The days and times of the meals are determined by your group to be convenient for all eight persons. The host pair provides meat, beverage and home; the second pair provides appetizer and vegetable; the third pair provides salad and bread; and the fourth pair provides dessert. Each month a different 2-person team becomes the host pair, and all pairs rotate the portion of the meal for which they are responsible.

Reflections

This has been a year of looking toward the future for Church Street. An exploratory committee worked through much of the year. It began with the idea of updating the Parish Hall – a fairly simple proposition. Along the way, the exploratory committee began to imagine a larger future for this project and, at the same time, a larger future for Church Street.

When the formal proposal was brought to Church Council in November, it recommended that a Master Plan be prepared encompassing the Parish Hall, entry and greeting areas of the church, expanding to throughout the first floor of the



original building. That recommendation was approved by Church Council.

This weekend, December 6-8, architects from Hartman-Cox Architects will be with us to see how we use this building and to imagine the best possibilities for a more useful, beautiful church. They will have conversations with several groups; they will observe the way people enter and leave the building; they will watch to see how we use the existing spaces. They have been asked to go all the way to the edges of our campus, looking for ways to improve the church's presence in the uptown area.

At the same time, the neighborhood around the church is moving in important, new directions. The Henley Street Bridge is almost complete. The Cumberland Avenue Strip will be refashioned into an urban living district. The uptown living environment is moving from Market Square toward Henley Street. The University has expanded in the direction of the church; students already make daily use of our parking. Life in uptown is being re-imagined right on the edges of our campus. We can take advantage of this growth and change.

This project goes far beyond building improvements; it is not merely an exercise in mortar and fresh paint. What I now see is that this church is looking for ways we will make our mission and our witness vital for the coming 50 years in the center of Knoxville. If we do nothing, we may let the future go off and leave us. With the Master Plan beginning, we are able to choose our future and our witness in Knoxville.
