
Discover Church Street

South Sudan Missionaries to Speak on July 13



Fred and Libby Dearing, Holston Conference Missionaries, will speak about their work in Yei, South Sudan during the Sunday School hour on Sunday, July 13, in the Parish Hall. Fred, a UMC pastor and District Superintendent and his wife Libby, were called to Sudan after Fred took an exploratory trip in 2006 with Anita Henderlight and Tom Seay. Anita had just read the book, "They Poured Fire on Us from the Sky," about the Lost Boys of Sudan. On the trip, they discovered that many United Methodists were angry and bewildered because they had been forgotten. The Dearings' initial work was rescue, many people had limited resources and were starving. Their work now includes pastor and teacher training, agriculture, micro finances and orphan ministry through GRACE Home and Green Land Home. Church Street United Methodist Church helps support the Dearings' work through Missions Committee funds, partnership in the Logos Church and other funding resources. We hope you will come hear

them speak about the many ways God is at work in South Sudan.



On August 17, the Renovation and Renewal Committee will offer a "reveal" of the Master Plan draft for the Church Street campus. This will be an opportunity for everyone in the church to see the results of many months of work by the committee and the architects. This will also be the opportunity for additional suggestions and, of course, questions about the Master Plan.

So, why should we consider building again? We build to update the whole church to the standard of the Nave, to make the



Eighty-five years ago, when this was nothing but a vacant lot, the people of Church Street Methodist Church, stood on this spot at the crossroads of government, business and the University to plant a church. Across the generations, this church has stood and served in full view of the Knoxville community. Here, we lift up Jesus Christ as Lord over everything that shapes the city. This is a better city because Church Street stands in witness and service here.

Now, we have been given the opportunity to reclaim this vision for the coming generations. By building anew, we stake out our commitment to witness and serve Jesus Christ at the crossroads of the city and the university. Everyone who passes this place will see that Church Street United Methodist Church stands at this spot, showing each one that Jesus Christ is still Lord over all.

Our decision to prepare Master Plan is already a statement that Church Street will be a Beacon: Living Christ, Teaching Christ, and Offering Christ for the next 85 years.

- We dream of caring for our heritage, maintaining and enhancing this holy place.
- We are determined to make an easier path for those for whom distance and access are a challenge.
- We will make this entire campus work better so we can continue providing meals for the nearby hungry, care for the elderly and teach our children.
- We dream of being, for the coming generations, a living, emerging, inclusive, faithful and welcoming downtown church, reflecting on our history and building for the future.
