## Financial Peace Orientations Begin Soon

We all need a plan for our money. Financial Peace University (FPU) is that plan! It teaches God's ways of handling money. Through video teaching, class



discussion and interactive small group activities, FPU presents biblical, practical steps to get from where you are to where you've dreamed you could be. Church Street offers two sessions of FPU: one starts in

September and one in January. Orientation sessions for the September class will be held at 2 p.m. on Sundays, August 24 and September 14. Just attend one of the orientation sessions, not both. ## Sign Up Now for Four Course Fellowship

The next 4-month rotation of Four Course Fellowship begins in September. In this fun "dinner club" fellowship opportunity, groups will be established and locations, appetizers, salads, entrees and desserts will rotate monthly within the group. If you have been part in the past please rejoin those of us who would like to meet or renew acquaintances.

**Here's how it works:** You sign up (with a spouse, relative or friend) and are placed in an 8-person group to share a meal and fellowship. Your group gets together once a month (for four months). The days and times of the meals are determined by your group. The host pair provides meat, beverage and home; the second pair provides appetizer and vegetable; the third pair provides salad and bread; and the fourth pair provides dessert. Each month a different 2-person team becomes the host pair.

## Jesus in the Gospels Study Begins Soon

The in-depth Bible study entitled Jesus in the Gospels will be offered beginning this fall. This 30-week course focuses on the portraits of Jesus found in the four Gospels. This study looks at the way each Gospel writer presents events and teachings and at the picture of Jesus that emerges in each of the Gospels. Taught by Rick Isbell, Minister of Discipleship, the course will meet on Sunday afternoons/evenings, 4-7 p.m. with a supper break. The orientation/interest meeting will be on Sunday, August 24, 5 p.m. in room 202.

Jesus in the Gospels is very similar to the Disciple Bible Studies. Each session will be comprised of video presentations by biblical scholars, input from leader, class discussions and application to today's world. There are two books for the study and cost is \$45 per person for the materials. 
What happens next? The purpose of the Grand Reveal was to inform. The Renovation & Renewal (R&R) Committee members know that this is a detailed plan. It touches almost every part of the original building and almost every parking lot and entry door. It was a lot to absorb in one hearing. Of course, some could not be present. For all these reasons, presenting the master plan will continue to be the focus for now.

Three offers:

## BEACON OF hope

The Getting Ahead classes at Beacon of Hope began on Monday, August 18, at Vestal UMC. Twelve applicants have been selected to participate as investigators in this eight-week study of poverty issues. They will explore how to deal critically and creatively with poverty related issues. The classes are facilitated (not taught) and investigators learn how to build their own resources to transform their lives and develop future plans for success.

Through its outreach at Vestal UMC, Church Street is one of a number of sponsoring groups conducting these classes in the Knoxville area. This approach is recognized as a game-changing approach to dealing with poverty issues nationally.

You can support this initiative financially by your contributions or by volunteering as mentors to support the investigators after they graduate.
