# Reflections

As I announced on Sunday morning, we will soon need to do something to repair the floors in the nave and chapel.

First, the dates:

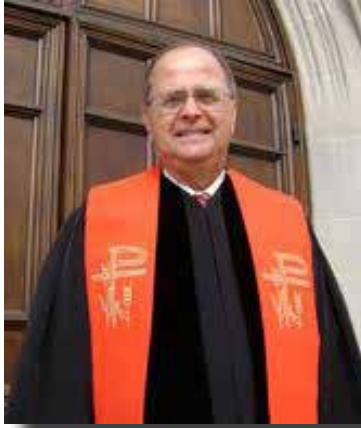
- September 14 & 21 (Sundays), we will worship in the Nave as usual. We must be careful about uneven places in the floor, but I believe we can navigate safely.
- September 28 (Sunday), we will begin worship in the gym so repairs can begin.
- October and November Sundays, we should expect Sunday worship in the gym.
- Beginning Wednesday, September 24 through the months of October and November, the Midweek Communion Service will be held in the Murphy Builders' Classroom (room 204) at Noon.
- Beginning Thursday, September 25 through the months of October and November, Community worship will be in the Murphy Builders' Classroom (room 204) at Noon.

So, beginning September 24, Wednesday worship will be in 204, beginning September 25, Community Worship will be in 204 and beginning September 28 Sunday worship will be in the gym. We are already preparing for worship in those spaces. Some additional events, scheduled for the Nave, cannot be held in the gym and are either being rescheduled or moved to other spaces.

Next, why does repairing the floor take so long? The plan for repair involves several steps. Before any work begins, we must evaluate the wood tiles to determine if the original floor can be reused. Of course, we want more than anything to preserve our heritage. The mastic on the back of each tile will have to be removed and all edges sanded. Obviously, this will be very labor intensive. Quotes will be obtained for this process and for new tiles that match the original floor in quality as closely as possible. If the original flooring cannot be reused, then new flooring will have to be manufactured. Then the following process will begin.

- Remove pews.
- Remove wood tiles and store them away.
- Grind the mastic from concrete.
- Prepare concrete for either the old tiles to be replaced or new tiles to be installed.
- Install floor tiles.
- Finish floor.
- Reinstall pews and chairs.

We will make worship in the gym and 204 as normal as possible. Of course, it will require some adjustments; the gym is not the Nave. Still, this congregation will gather for worship each week without fail. We will still be Church Street.
