UMCOR Channels Ebola-Fighting Assistance

As the Ebola virus outbreak in West Africa accelerates, the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) continues to channel medical supplies, equipment and protective gear to the affected regions.

To date, UMCOR has sent nearly \$400,000 in grants to Sierra Leone and Liberia. Funds support the construction of holding units and the purchase of tents, personal protective equipment, training for health staff, public messaging about Ebola, and safe handling of deceased bodies.

Whenever possible, funds are sent to United Methodist health boards to purchase healthcare and other supplies locally. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), in a September 4 report, the total number of probable, confirmed and suspected cases is 3,707, with 1,848 deaths, in five countries, mainly Liberia, Sierra Leone and Guinea.

UMCOR asks donors who want to help fight the Ebola outbreak to please give through the International Disaster Response Advance, #982450, to ensure "the appropriateness, timeliness and quality" of the materials. You can donate now online at www.umcor.org.

Several years ago our Education Committee provided tote bags for all of our Sunday School teachers that had a picture of the “Teaching Christ” statue and the wording “Called to Share the Story” on it. It was but one way we could say thank you to all our teachers and provide a tangible expression of appreciation. In reflecting on that small gift and the wording, I am reminded that those who are called to teach and lead in our Christian education ministries are called to share the story of Jesus Christ in so many ways with so many persons.



Whether one teaches on a regular basis in our Sunday School with children, youth or adults or whether one teaches in one of our many small group studies, with our youth Night Life program or anytime during the week, the teacher is one who shares not only in words but also through his/her actions. The teacher is one that others look to for knowledge, wisdom, guidance and example as together we learn what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. I think of the many teachers I have had in my life time from whom I learned a lot. I learned not only knowledge and wisdom for my life, but I learned from their example of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. I learned how to love in spite of difficult behavior, I learned how to be patient when you don't have the time, I learned how to give from a generous and thankful heart, and I learned what it means to be Christian out in the market place.

Each of us in the community of faith called the Church are called to share the story of Jesus Christ not only in words but also with our actions. We are all teachers one way or another. You would be amazed at how many children, youth and adults are influenced by the words and behavior of their teachers, leaders and those around them. On Christian Education Sunday, September 21, we recognize all those who teach and lead in educational ministries, and give Bibles to our 3rd Grade children. We give thanks for their example of what it looks like to be a disciple of Jesus Christ and their willingness to share the story in words and actions.

Norman Shawchuck got it right when he wrote this prayer in one of his devotions, “May my faith have feet and hands, a voice and a heart, that it may minister to others ... that the gospel I profess may be seen in my life.” That is my prayer for all our teachers this day.
