

Reflections

Thirty-seven. The number of persons that we named on All Saints Day this past Sunday. As I looked over the list before the service, I caught my breath. When I was new at Church Street, most of them would have been strangers. No longer. These were known to me – as they have always been known to you. My first response is, "Oh, no! That one cannot be gone." All Saints Day stands as a reminder that death does not



ask our permission; it simply takes. We remain to carry on. The fear that we are somehow diminished is hard to shake.

Except that we observe in Sunday worship the All Saints reading, the day would be hard to take. But, because of Christ, who holds the keys to Death and Hell (Rev. 1.18), it is a day of victory. Because of Christ, it is the day of our God.

The other bookend, as it were, to this week is Children's Day. On Sunday, the children will lead us in worship. On Sunday, the children will give witness to their faith in the Great Congregation. Sue Isbell, our Children's Ministry Director, reminds me each year that the children do not want to do kid stuff in church. They love the way we worship and want to lead real worship on this Sunday.

Make your way to worship this Sunday. Do not come expecting to watch a bunch of sweet kids putting on a show for their elders. Come to worship. Come to honor the God of heaven and earth. The only difference is that the worship leaders will be a bit shorter than usual. We gather, as always, for worship.

One of the joys of being the Church is that we call all generations to gather before God. There is a healthy wholeness to our gatherings. We even celebrate the now departed and those not-quite-ready to be born. Unlike school and your work-place and cardiac rehab, we allow the very old and the very young to sit together at our most important gatherings. We not only allow it, we encourage it!

We are building in this place a community of welcome. Jesus said, "Come, ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." I would add, Come, young who are hungry for the wisdom of welcoming elders, these grownups have much to share. Come, elders who long to hear the voices of children lifted in song, these children and youth will lift your spirits.

This is the week between All Saints and Children's Sunday. We could not have timed this any better.
