Church Conference This Sunday

A Church Conference of all full members of Church Street United Methodist Church will be held on Sunday, November 23, at 6 p.m. in the church gym. All full members of the church, both adults and youth, are invited with voice and vote on the agenda below.

Three agenda items:

1. Propose that the Draft Master Plan be approved as the Final Master Plan.
2. Propose that the church begin Phase 1 of the Master Plan: Renovation of the Parish Hall with new finishes, controllable light fixtures, wood beams and wainscot and enhanced audiovisual systems; Construction of a new three-story addition on the Magnolia lot with a welcome and gathering area, elevators, stairs, accessible restrooms and storage; Construction of the Magnolia structured parking scheme to provide covered parking and accessibility to the Nave and Parish Hall. The estimated cost for Phase 1 is \$9.3 million.
3. Propose that a capital campaign and campaign committee be authorized to seek funding for Phase 1. Jean Galyon and Dwight Wade are proposed co-chairs; David Lewis of Horizons Stewardship is proposed as campaign consultant.

Dinner will be served at 5 p.m. in Parish Hall. Cost is \$7 for adults, \$4 for children (ages 10 & under) with a family maximum of \$25. As you know, Cabel Trent retired from his ministry at Church Street on October 31. We took the time on this last Sunday to honor and thank him and Doris for the years they have given.

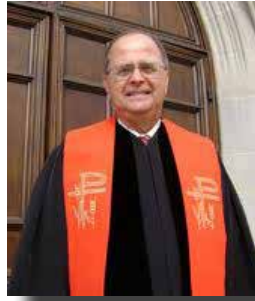
Since he accepted the role of Special Needs Pastor, some 21 years ago, Cabel has been a stable and loving presence at Church Street Church. One of the interesting moments came when I reviewed his written job description (about a year ago). I knew from the time I arrived that he used that document as a launching pad and not a boundary. He worked more hours, more intensely, driving further, staying away from home longer than the job description ever expected. In other words, he defined the job; the job did not define him. And, this church has loved him in return.

He has demonstrated a pastor's heart in my many conversations with him about the daily work of visitation ministry. I told him when I came here that I did not want him committed to meetings; I wanted him available for visitation – anytime, anywhere, without any conflict. He has done just that. He has followed “his people” to hospitals, nursing homes, and gravesides without fail. He did this with a clear understanding of the ministry of visitation and presence.

So, we owe him a great deal of thanks. We also owe Doris, his wife, a great deal of thanks for the many hours she did without him at home these years while other pastors were retired at home.

Consider the character of Cabel's ministry. He focused on the personal contact – one by one, mostly. While others focused on the crowd or the large meeting, he focused on finding people wherever they were. In a large church where it is easy to get lost or overlooked, he valued the individual. His prizes were not the biggest crowd or the largest offering; his prizes were finding members with whom we had lost contact or being present when someone needed to talk. He offered loyalty and gladly responded to our loyalty. In a city that runs full speed all the time, he was determined to take the time necessary to listen to people. His ministry has had a chosen and clear character.

So, thank you, Cabel Trent. Thank you, Doris. You have been and you still are a blessing to the people of Church Street United Methodist Church.
