## “Reflections...on Serving”

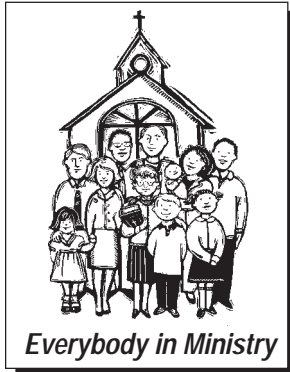

The church ought to be the place where Christians learn to act like...well, Christians. Today, I am thinking about Christians serving as Christians. We should find places of service which arise from our conviction that the Spirit has given us gifts for the strength of our church. Sometimes this service will be occasional – as the opportunity arises. Other times this service will be an hour a week stretching over many years. For some this service will lead to a lifetime work that defines us.

I remember Ralph Culvahouse at St. Paul Church. He was a one-man welcoming crew, stationing himself at the main door where people entered the building. There he made everyone’s arrival on Sunday morning an occasion. Often people who entered the church through another door would swing past Mr. Culvahouse’s door just to get the greeting. Greeting people as they arrived at church was his job and his joy.

Many years ago, Celia and I were guests at Peck’s Memorial UMC in Jefferson City. (This was the same family church that produced Carolyn Peck, the women’s basketball coach.) It was homecoming and we arrived just in time for lunch. Our hostess took us directly to

the food tables. There she introduced us to several women: “She is the light bread maker; this lady is the piemaker; over here, this is the cake maker.” Each of them had a specialty for which they were proud and gladly obligated.



Over the month of January, we will focus on Everybody in Ministry. It is our way of encouraging everyone in the church to join in the work of the church. It is our way of inviting everyone to find a place of service in the nurturing or outreach ministries of the church. On the last Sunday of January, you will have the opportunity to name some

ministries where you would consider serving.

As John Wesley said in his Covenant Prayer:

**I am no longer my own, but thine.  
Put me to what thou wilt, rank me  
with whom thou wilt.  
Put me to doing, put me to suffering.  
Let me be employed for thee or laid  
aside for thee,  
exalted for thee or brought low for  
thee.  
I freely and heartily yield all things  
to thy pleasure and disposal.**

Let this be our prayer also. Christians, you see, ought to serve like Christians.
