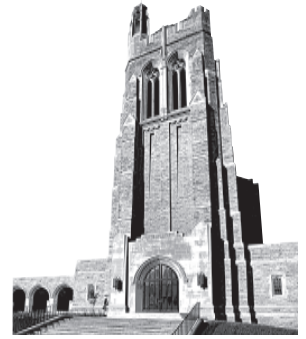

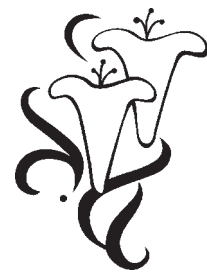

Did you know... *Easter Lily Legends*

- For many, the beautiful trumpet-shaped white flowers symbolize purity, virtue, innocence, hope and life—the spiritual essence of Easter.

- The lily has long symbolized the Resurrection. According to legend, when Jesus walked the earth, all the plants and animals — beautiful and not so beautiful — bowed their heads in respect. The lily, however, considered itself too beautiful and proud to bow. After the Crucifixion, the lily was so ashamed it bowed its head and continues to do so as a sign of respect.

- Often called the “white-robed apostles of hope,” lilies were found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ’s agony. Tradition has it that the beautiful white lilies sprung up where drops of Christ’s sweat fell to the ground in his final hours of sorrow and deep distress. Churches continue this tradition at Easter time by banking their altars and surrounding their crosses with masses of Easter Lilies, to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and hope of life everlasting.

- A mark of purity and grace throughout the ages, the regal white lily is a fitting symbol of the greater meaning of Easter. Gracing millions of homes and churches, the flowers embody joy, hope and life. Whether given as a gift or enjoyed in your own home, the Easter Lily serves as a beautiful reminder that Easter is a time for rejoicing and celebrating.

Ever noticed how much better your day goes when you've spent a few minutes outdoors, walking or simply breathing in the fresh air? Health professionals have long recognized the mental, physical, and emotional benefits of spending unstructured time in God's created beauty. Our children need this too!



In recent years, our church's playground has drastically deteriorated. **State health and safety specialists have declared that soon it will no longer be safe for our children enrolled in the Child Day Care Center and for young folk of our congregation, who regularly use the playground.** A no-frills fundraising initiative is underway, and volunteers have been hard at work for many months procuring half the necessary replacement funds of \$51,000.

From the sale of note cards and plants, through photography commissions and bake sales, a significant amount was garnered. The largest amount, however, has been gleaned from parking cars for special events at the Convention Center across the street. A number of important shows are already on the convention calendar and your help would be of great benefit to our cause!

“Reflections....on Easter”

“Christ is risen! Christ is risen, indeed!” So goes the shout of Easter morning. On this day, we celebrate the victory of Jesus Christ over death. This shout is not just for the day we die, confident that heaven now stands open before us. This shout is for every challenge to God’s claim to be Lord and Redeemer of all creation.

The world is sadly filled with powers and would-be powers who would use the power of death to enforce their views upon human life.

Recently, two female suicide bombers detonated bombs in the Moscow subways. As I write this, their identity and their message is not known. Still, they would use death and the threat of death to force their message on that city and that nation.

In the same week, the FBI arrested nine members of a militia in Michigan that was preparing an attack on police. Their idea was to use this attack and the follow-up attack on the funerals they caused to stir up unrest in American communities like ours. They would use death and the threat of death to force their

message on that community and the nation.

Earlier in the week, a Nashville father experienced an attack via SUV from someone who disagreed with the political bumper sticker on his car. Again, the attacker, a person remarkably like any of us, would use death and the threat of death to enforce his point.

In the cross, Jesus Christ took upon himself that threat of death; he died there for the world’s healing. On Easter, Jesus was raised as God’s unmistakable “Yes” against all those who would say, “No” to life and hope. On Easter, Jesus was raised as God’s promise that the Kingdom is for all who come with no currency and no power greater than simple faith in Him. Easter stands as God’s assurance that those who would use death and the threat of death to do their dirty work will not have the last word.

So come on Easter morning. Join the glad shout: “He is risen. He is risen, indeed!” And life steps forward — from Christ’s tomb and from all our tombs as well.

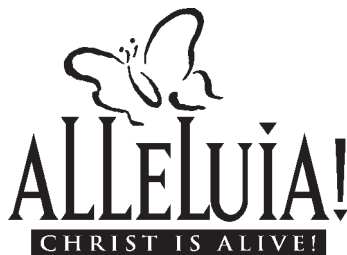
