Jesus commanded that we "love each other as I have loved you." Stephen Ministers answer that call by caring for those who are hurting.

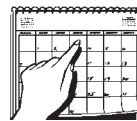

“Reflections....on Pastors, Pyramids and Pies”

Each time I read in Mark 10 how Jesus welcomed children and blessed them, my mind always stretches beyond the words on the page. I imagine Jesus spending an afternoon with a group of children and speculate on what they might have done together.

When this passage is part of a Sunday school lesson, I always ask children what they would do with Jesus if they could spend an afternoon with him. Their answers span a range of activities, but my answer is always the same: I would ask him to tell me a story.

Storytelling is the oldest form of Christian Education and, of course, Jesus was a master storyteller. Communicating our faith with children through stories is still one of the most effective things we do, but the example we set for children is even more important.

Last year as we were planning our Vacation Bible School we decided to ask our pastors to come each morning and tell the Bible story to the children during the gathering time. It was such a success in 2009 that we decided to go for a bit more in 2010 and the result was incredible!

Our theme was Egypt. We followed Joseph’s story from prison to palace and for our four days of bible “study” Rick Isbell, Sarah Varnell, Andy Ferguson, and Jan Buxton-Wade creatively and effectively brought the Bible to life from our storyteller’s chair.

To add to the festivities of the week, “Pastor Darryll” Rasnake led our music with the able assistance of our youth band. The pyramids were rocking each morning

with lively motions and energetic voices throughout Parish Hall. The children loved every minute of it, and so did a lot of adults.

Just when we thought we had utilized our pastors’ talents as much as possible for one week, another idea emerged. To reinforce how Joseph collected food during the seven years of famine, our coordinators proposed a food collection for Montgomery Village. Boys would be against the girls, with a BIG incentive for each side to win: If the boys won, Miss Sue would get a pie in the face. But if the girls won, Pastor Darryll would take the pie for the boys’ team.

The excitement was obvious. When a six-year-old stopped me in the hallway and said, “Miss Sue, what’s your favorite kind of pie?” I knew the competition was intense. By the end of the week over 500 cans were collected and, I’m happy to say, the girls won.

Each day I am thankful that we are blessed with pastors at our church who not only get involved with our children when they are invited to do so, but also look for ways to be involved. I believe they see the value of children in our congregation, as growing leaders in the church and heirs to our rich tradition.

But best of all, I think they truly enjoy the time they spend with children. Just look at the faces of the children as they pass them in the hallways or greet them before worship each week. These are *their* pastors too, eagerly getting involved on their level, helping them see glimpses of the Kingdom, and, yes, even taking a pie in the face along the way.
