Celebrate 10 Years of Labyrinth Walks in 2011

Labyrinth facilitators needed

2011 marks the tenth year of our labyrinth ministry at Church Street.

It was early in 2001 when the congregation was invited to write prayers on the canvas path that eventually became our labyrinth. More than 150 adults, children and youth participated in the four days of inaugural walks in March of that year. Now as we look toward 2011, ten labyrinth walks are already scheduled to help us observe liturgical seasons and holy days as well as significant events in our world today.



If you are not familiar with the labyrinth, it is a centuries-old tool that allows time for personal prayer and meditation. For early Christians, walking the circular path to the center symbolized a way to Christ. Today labyrinths are found worldwide in churches, hospitals, parks, and even corporate buildings. The labyrinth is not a "new age" gimmick, but an ancient symbol of wholeness and unity. Walking the labyrinth is simple, calming, and powerful to those who choose to follow its path.

Labyrinth facilitators are required each time the labyrinth is available for walking. A facilitator volunteers for a few hours to sit with the labyrinth, monitor candles and music, and provide new walkers instruction on entering the path. One training session is all you need to become a labyrinth facilitator, and it is one of the most stress-free volunteer positions available in the church.

“Reflections...on How much is enough?”

It’s been a tough couple of years. In the midst of our economic anxiety, the church comes to us and asks for a pledge of financial support. For some of us, it will seem like a challenge to make any commitment. For those who are willing to commit, the question of “How much should I give?” may seem more difficult to answer than ever.

The Bible has no shortage of answers to the question of, “How much should I give?” The Old Testament tithes (10%) of income and wealth actually overlapped so that the accumulated effect would require giving more than ten percent annually. The Gospels offer the story of Zaccheus who gave *half* of his wealth to the poor. Jesus repeatedly called for people to give *everything*. Members of the first century church sold *all* they had and contributed it to the work of God.

Based upon our actual levels of giving today, most of us must consider the tithe as an archaic and irrelevant concept. And if we balk at tithing, we are certainly going to discount the New Testament examples of giving. If we decide that we are not called to give in accordance with the teachings of either the Old Testament or the New Testament, exactly what teaching from the Bible about giving are we following? Have we decided that the Bible directs us to give whatever we want, whatever does not make us uncomfortable?

We struggle with the question of “how much” because our perspective is all wrong. We think of the money that we earn as “ours” and see our gift to God as a surrender of “our” wealth. In truth, everything that we have already belongs to God.



If a farm-worker goes into his farmer’s fields, plows the ground, sows the seed, and works the harvest, does the fruit of the harvest belong to the worker or to the farmer? Would the worker ever refuse to give the farmer even a portion of the harvest? Imagine that a factory worker installs the factory machines, unloads the raw materials, and labors to fabricate a product. Would the worker ever imagine that the product belongs to him instead of to the factory owner?

God has blessed us with all of the tools and raw materials to produce the “harvests” that we enjoy. We have been given physical and mental talents, opportunities for education, and the blessing of an economic environment that allows unprecedented levels of prosperity. Yes, we work hard. But does that mean the harvest belongs to us instead of the master?

Stewardship means that we are the keepers and protectors of something that belongs to someone else. The question is not what I am willing to do. The question is what does God want me to do with the things that He has entrusted to me? Who is the master of my wealth – me or God?
