## “Reflections...on “Where are the Nine?”

*As Jesus entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices, saying, “Master, have mercy on us.” He said to them, “Go and show yourselves to the priests.” As they went they were cleansed. One of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He fell on his face at Jesus’ feet, giving him thanks. Then Jesus answered, “Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine?”*

[Luke 17:11-18]

Halloween was exhausting. First there was the dressing up. Then there were the endless photographs of squirmy kids, the trips to let the relatives see the costumes, the neighborhood gathering, and the long walk through two subdivisions. Finally, we returned home to sort through the candy and swap out the loot. But, the most exhausting part of the evening was the required shout to my girls at every house, “Did you say thank you?” I must have told my girls a hundred times, “Don’t forget to say thank you.” Eventually, there were the threats – “If you forget to say thank you one more time, we will stop trick-or-treating and go home!”

As we get older, we generally develop better manners, but our politeness hides what underneath is still a lack of *genuine* thankfulness. Genuine thankfulness ought to be revealed in actions and not just words. We say that we are thankful – but are we? The story of the ten lepers from Luke is always sobering to me. Ten men experienced God’s grace but only one gave thanks.

“Where are the nine?” How could nine of the ten people who had received a miraculous gift of healing fail to return and give thanks? Did they fail to appreciate the miraculous nature of their healing? Were they confused as to the source of the gift? Were they so engrossed by the gift that they forgot to acknowledge the giver?

During this season of stewardship, we have talked about how much we love our church and how we can see God’s activity in this place. We have talked about what it means to be a steward



and to recognize God as the master of our possessions. The final thing we ought

to focus on is the importance of having a thankful heart. Giving should not be a duty or a burden. It should be a celebration. The appreciation of what we have been given, and the recognition of who has been the giver, should result in an outward expression of thankfulness which culminates in action. Sincere thankfulness ought to result in thanksgiving.

This Sunday is Commitment Sunday. I hope that we can come together in worship like the “one” who ran to Jesus, fell on his face and gave thanks. I hope to see everyone at worship for a celebration of our commitment to continue as a vibrant ministry of God in the heart of our city. Please spend the week in prayer so that you will come prepared to join together as one body in making the commitment of support that will secure our ministry through 2011.
