**Sign up in breezeway this Sunday!**

The next 4-month rotation of Four Course Fellowship begins in January 2011. Groups will be established and locations, appetizers, salads, entrees and desserts will rotate monthly within the group.

• **Here's how it works:** You sign up (with a spouse, relative or friend) and are placed in an 8-person group to share a meal and fellowship. Your group gets together once a month (for four months). The days and times of the meals are determined by your group to be convenient for all eight persons.

The host pair provides meat, beverage and home; the second pair provides appetizer and vegetable; the third pair provides salad and bread; and the fourth pair provides dessert. Each month a different 2-person team in your group becomes the host pair, and all pairs rotate the portion of the meal for which they are responsible.

Christmas is on the way; this is the season of anticipation. One of the high points of this season is the Christmas Eve Service. Because we are planning a few changes this year, I want to outline plans for our Christmas Eve services.

We will celebrate Christmas Eve with three services. We hope that you will be part of one of these, along with your Christmas family.

• **3:00 pm** — a service specifically designed for families with young children but all are welcome. (Note the new time of 3 pm.) The center of this service will be building the manger scene and the reading of the Christmas story. The serving of communion, blessing of the babies and candlelighting are included. Children of all ages (0+ to 106) are anticipated. We hope this new time will give children the chance to be part of this service and still get home for supper.

• **5:00 pm and 10:30 pm** — *Service of Candlelight and Communion.* Join us

at 5 pm and 10:30 pm as the Parish Adult Choir and instrumentalists provide a pre-service concert; the order of service begins at 5:30 pm and 11:00 pm. (Note:

The start times have been adjusted slightly from past years.) The center of these services is the great liturgy of holy communion and the lighting of candles as we sing.

This season is filled to the brim with occasions great and small; there are jobs (like shopping and cooking and decorating and going from place to place) to be done every day. On Christmas Eve, all this busyness finds its purpose in the angels’ announcement: “Unto us is born in the City of David a Savior.” With the coming of Christmas, preparation is finished. Now, we spend the rest of our lives discovering the fullness of all that God has done in this gift, this Savior.

## Celebrate 10 Years of Labyrinth Walks in 2011



The labyrinth is a centuries-old tool that allows time for personal prayer and meditation. It is not a “new age” gimmick, but an ancient symbol of wholeness and unity. Walking the labyrinth is simple, calming, and powerful to those who choose to follow its path. For early Christians, walking the circular path to the center symbolized a way to Christ.

At Church Street, labyrinth facilitators are needed each time the labyrinth is available for walking. A facilitator volunteers for a few hours to sit with the labyrinth, monitor candles and music, and provide new walkers instruction on entering the path. One training session is all you need to become a labyrinth facilitator.
